Ready or Not



It is always so interesting to see how the children of Saint Aidan's react and participate in Sunday School and Children's Chapel. This year has been absolutely incredible so far in both, but especially Sunday School.

We are using a Lego based curriculum for our prek-3rd graders, which they love (I mean, who doesn't love Legos?). The way it works is the teachers tell the children the Bible story for the day, and give some context for where the story falls in the Bible, who the main characters are, etc. While every Sunday has been wonderful, there are three stories that I want to share with you about Sunday school this year.

Story number 1: It was getting near the end of class and I was getting pictures of the children's lego creations, and reminding the children how much time is left. One of the parents came in, and after bringing the child's attention to his parent's presence, he bursts into tears. He was not finished with the Bible story and he hadn't put himself in his Lego creation yet. He wasn't done and didn't want to leave Sunday School. The parent then went and helped him put the finishing touches on his Bible story Lego creation. It was incredible to see a child having so much fun with Sunday School and reluctant to leave.

Story number 2: This particular Sunday we talked about Mary visiting Elizabeth while they were each pregnant with Jesus and John, respectively. When the teacher was giving context, she spoke about Mary and Elizabeth being cousins, which meant that Jesus and John were

also cousins. That in itself caused great excitement with the children as they thought about their own cousins and how cool it was that Jesus had a cousin too. As they progressed in the story to talk about John leaping in Elizabeth's womb as he felt Jesus' presence, the children became even more engrossed in the story and what was happening. The way the teacher worded the children's response to this part of the story was "You literally could see the little wheels turning in their heads. They were pretty amazed to know that Jesus and John were cousins but they were gob smacked that the babies reacted to one another while in the womb." The children weren't just sitting and waiting for the Legos. They were fully involved in the story and soaking up every bit.



Story number 3: This one is short, but shows just how much the children love Sunday school. One parent told me every Sunday her children are excited to go to Sunday school, and skipping Sunday School is not an option in the children's opinion. Simply going to Children's Chapel isn't enough, Sunday School is a requirement in their minds.

I have been told by numerous parents that on the way home from church, their kids spend the time telling them about Sunday School and what they learned, and what they built, and why they chose that part of the story. I always love seeing the children having fun, but seeing them fun, learning the stories, why they are important, and still talking about them when they leave church brings me so much joy, and appreciation to all those who help to teach (not just in Sunday School) our children these Bible stories and what it means to follow God.

Rehearsal Free Christmas Pageant

Join us at 4:00 PM Christmas Eve as we celebrate Christ's birth. This pageant allows all kids to participate in the telling of Christ's birth, costumes and all! There are no practices leading up to the pageant just show-up and step into the greatest story ever told. The pageant concludes with traditional Communion and candlelight prayer.
