 Georgia Adopt-A-Stream awarded us with the "Watershed Award" (NGO) for our outstanding volunteer monitors, trainers and groups. The data



collected has been integral in efforts to replace dozens of septic tanks and make other critical decisions regarding the health of the river.

 At our annual River Cleanup, 250 volunteers contributed more than 570 service hours to remove 8 tons of trash and debris from the St. Marys River and its tributaries.

## Citizen Science Opportunity

St. Marys Riverkeeper is focused on identifying sources of non-point-source pollution by regularly sampling more than 50 sites throughout the watershed. A dedicated system of Citizen Scientists are trained to monitor water quality using Georgia Adopt-a-Stream protocols, and we also train teachers and students at high schools in Georgia and Florida to provide the chemical and bacterial water data. We share our data widely and work closely with government agencies to provide critical information needed to maintain clean water systems.
