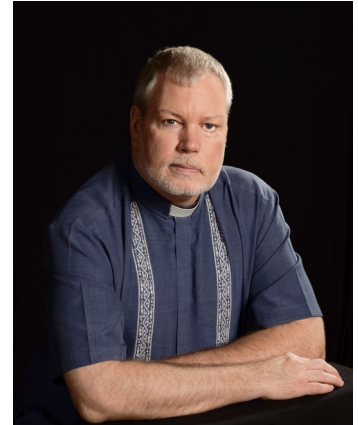

Dear Parishioners, Friends and Guests of Our Lady of Guadalupe Church,

Each year the Catholic Church begins the Easter Season with liturgical celebrations of special joy and importance. On Easter Sunday each year we bring closure to the great Paschal Triduum, the “Three Days” that began on Holy Thursday evening with the Mass of the Lord’s Supper and included the Good Friday Liturgy of the Lord’s Passion and the great Easter Vigil on the night of Holy Saturday. Easter Sunday also begins the Easter Octave (“Eight Days”) that concludes with the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday (the Second Sunday of Easter). On these joyful days when the Church throughout the world celebrates the “Paschal Mystery” of our Lord Jesus Christ, this parish community, its pastor and its staff offer to all of you our sincere wishes—and, on your behalf, our fervent prayers for a truly blessed Easter. The Church's ancient cry of jubilation, "Alleluia! Christ is risen!! Alleluia! He is risen indeed!!!", still echoes in our hearts, and in our proclamation of faith.

Our Easter celebrations remind us that at all times of the year we Catholics celebrate an Easter faith, for our faith is in the One who died on the cross for the sake of us all, and who rose triumphant from the grave to set humanity free from sin and death. In this same spirit, we pray that our lives will draw ever-increasing strength from its saving power, so that we may face with steadfast courage and with unwavering hope all the challenges and trials that life places before us, including those of the COVID-19 pandemic that yet continues.

As we begin our celebration of the great 50 days of Easter, we thank everyone who joins us—whether in person or via our livestreamed broadcasts—in celebrating what God has done. May the new life of the risen Christ, and the new hope his divine mercy offers, be an ever-freshening source of joy and vitality for you and for those who are dear to you. We likewise hope and pray that you will join us again soon and often as we celebrate at OLG the fullness of the saving mystery of Christ in all the feasts and seasons of our Christian lives. We welcome your presence, we delight in your participation, and we pray for the gifts of God on your behalf—always. As the risen Jesus said to his disciples in the upper room when he appeared to them on the evening of the first day of the week....

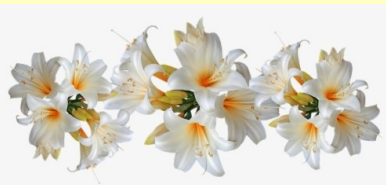

Archdiocese of Seattle Bishops Speak Out Against Hatred

March 22, 2021 – It is with heavy hearts that we offer this statement regarding the recent acts of violence and hatred against our Asian American brothers and sisters. The recent attacks, both nationally and locally in our own archdiocese, are indicative of a new era of hatred that must come to an end.

Harm against our Asian American brothers and sisters is harm inflicted on everyone. As members of the one Body of Christ, we wish to acknowledge the pain, the fear, the anger and the stress our Asian American brothers and sisters are currently experiencing. With a history of racism, violence and suppression, these fears for this community are very real and cannot be ignored.

Today, the Asian American and Pacific Islander American communities give life to the Northwest and the Catholic Church of the Archdiocese of Seattle. These brothers and sisters have a long history in this region, dating to the 1800s. They have enriched the life of the Northwest, sharing their traditions and cultures with our Catholic parishes and our communities. We are so grateful for their presence and the gift of diversity they bring to our communities.

As interconnected brothers and sisters, made in the image and likeness of God, we implore everyone to respect one another, and honor the dignity of every person. Jesus said, “I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another” (John 13:34).

Each of us can make choices to demonstrate how we stand together in love and solidarity against racist acts of hatred. By baptism, we are called to bring more love and understanding into our world. This starts with our families, our neighbors, our parishes and the larger community. We continue to pray for the protection, healing and strength of our Asian American brothers and sisters while we stand in solidarity with them and continue to address the evils of racism.

Ten Tips for Protecting Children and Offering Outreach to Victims/Survivors

1 Sexual abuse is about the victim.

Many people are affected by abuse but the individual most impacted is the victim who has suffered a violation of trust that can affect his or her entire life.

2 The residual effects of having been abused can last a lifetime.

The sense of violation goes deep into a person's psyche and feelings of anger, shame, hurt and betrayal can build long after the abuse has taken place. Those who have been abused can heal, but it often takes time, therapy, and the support of loved ones.

3 No one has the right to have access to children.

No one, no matter who they are, has an automatic right to be around children or young people who are in the care of the Church without proper screening and without following the rules.

4 Common sense is not all that common.

Dioceses, schools, parishes, and especially families, must educate themselves and others on how to protect children.

5 Child sexual abuse can be prevented.

It is critical to build safety barriers around children and young people to keep them from harm—such as protective guardians, codes of conduct, background evaluations, policies and procedures, and safety training programs.

6 Feeling heard leads toward healing.

Relief from hurt and anger often comes when one feels heard, when one's pain

and concerns are taken seriously, and a victim/survivor's suffering, pain, and anger are acknowledged.

7 You cannot always predict who will be an abuser.

Experience shows that most abuse is committed by someone who has gained the trust of a victim/survivor and his/her family.

8 There are behavioral warning signs of child abusers.

Some abusers isolate a potential victim by giving him or her undue attention or lavish gifts, others allow young people to participate in activities which their parents or guardians would not approve, such as watching pornography, drinking alcohol, using drugs, and excessive touching, such as wrestling and tickling.

9 People can be taught to identify grooming behavior.

Grooming behaviors are the actions which abusers take to project the image that they are kind, generous, caring people, while their intent is to lure a minor into an inappropriate relationship. Offenders can be patient and may groom their victim, his or her family, or community for years.

10 Background checks are important.

Background checks in churches, schools and other organizations keep predators away from children both because they scare off some predators and because they uncover past actions which should ban an adult from working or volunteering with children.

April Is Child Abuse Prevention Month

If you suffered abuse, it was not your fault. If you are a victim of sexual abuse by a priest, deacon, or individual representing the Catholic Church, there are several things you can do:

- Contact the appropriate law enforcement agency, which can help determine options for making a criminal complaint.
- Contact a local child protection agency, a private attorney, a support group an abuse hotline, or a mental health professional.
- Contact a diocesan or eparchial victim assistance coordinator who is available to help victims/survivors make a formal complaint of abuse to the diocese or eparchy. The Victim Assistance Coordinator is also available to arrange a personal meeting with the bishop or his representative and to obtain support for the needs of the individual and families.
- If you believe someone is in imminent danger or there is a situation of current abuse involving a minor please call 911.
- To report an allegation of abuse or mishandling of allegations of sexual abuse by a bishop, please visit the Catholic Bishop Abuse Reporting Service website.
