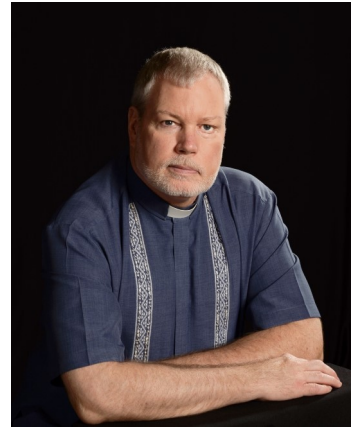

Pastor's Page



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During Ordinary Time, the liturgical period we are currently in, the gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke are read in each of the three years of the Sunday Liturgical Calendar—Year A, Year B and Year C respectively. Readings from the Gospel of John are proclaimed during other periods of the Liturgical Year, the seasons of Lent and Easter in particular. However, due to the relative brevity of the Gospel of Mark, a mere 16 chapters in length compared to 28 in Matthew and 27 in Luke, readings from John's gospel are also included in Year B during Ordinary Time. Each time the Year B gospel readings from Mark are proclaimed there is a period of five successive weeks when gospel readings from Saint John replace the usual readings from Mark. Every three years this happens in Year B on the 17th – 21st Sundays in Ordinary Time. The portions of John's gospel that are proclaimed on these Sundays are taken from chapter six wherein Bread of Life discourse is found. Indeed, the purpose of these gospel readings is to lead us more deeply into the mystery of the Eucharist wherein Christ comes to us as “the living bread” who has come down from heaven.

I strongly encourage us all to take the time and to make the effort to prayerfully read chapter six in the Gospel of Saint John as we move through this portion of the Sunday Lectionary in the coming weeks (July 25th – August 22nd) and as we listen to the words of Jesus in his Bread of Life discourse. I will be making a point to offer reflections on the Sacrament of the Eucharist in my preaching of the homily at our Sunday Masses during this period, and your own familiarity with these gospel readings will be a help to your own understanding of what Jesus is telling us and of what we are doing when we celebrate and receive the “true food” and the “true drink” of Christ's flesh and blood in the Eucharistic sacrament. I urge us all to spend time reading, thinking about and meditating upon these words of Jesus in the Johannine Bread of Life Discourse so that we might all encounter the Lord more deeply as he comes to us and offers himself to us in the mystery of the Eucharist. Please read John 6:1-69 over the course of the next five Sundays, as we profess our faith in the words of Jesus proclaimed in the Bread of Life discourse.

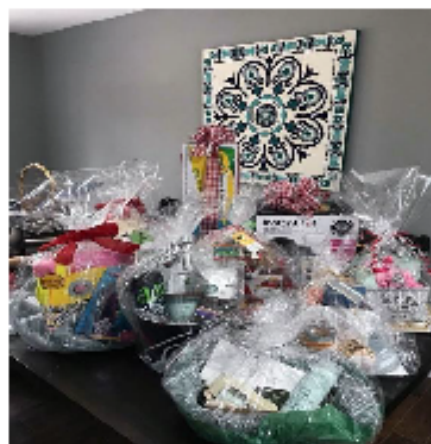

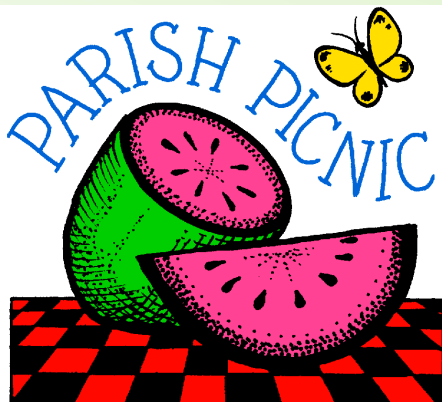
