

Pastor's Page



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In May of 2020, the Vatican wrote to the English-speaking Conferences of Catholic Bishops throughout the world—e. g., Canada, England, Ireland, Australia, New Zealand, Wales, USA, etc.—regarding the wording of the concluding doxology of the Collects (Opening Prayers) used in the Roman Missal and other liturgical books.

Specifically, it was pointed out that the current English translation, which concludes **“...in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever”** is incorrect. There is no mention of the “one” in the Latin, and the word Deus (God) in the Latin text is a reference to Christ, not to the Trinity. Therefore, the correct translation, which is already being used in the Roman Missal in other languages—French, Spanish, German, Japanese, Arabic, Aramaic, etc.—is simply: **“...in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.”**

Out of a desire to affirm this Christological truth, and in an effort to make the English-language translation of the Missal properly reflect the Latin original, as do all the other languages, the Vatican has instructed that the English-language translation of the Roman Missal begin conforming to the proper wording. This change in wording to the concluding doxology of the Collects prayed by the priest officially went into effect on Ash Wednesday, February 17th, even though I began to employ the change earlier than that. **The words “...one God, for ever and ever” have simply been replaced with “...God, for ever and ever.” The word “one” has been taken out.** A few parishioners have noticed the change and inquired about it, and I thought it would be helpful to offer an explanation for all to read.

This slight change in the wording of the English translation of the Latin text in no way alters what these prayers intend to say, indeed they clarify and make the wording more accurate and precise. Neither do they change in any way the Church’s doctrine of God (Trinitarian Theology) nor our understanding of Jesus (Christology). The Church continues to believe and teach what it has always believed and taught about the Blessed Trinity (three Persons in one God, and one God in three Divine Persons) and about Jesus Christ (the second Person of the Blessed Trinity, our Savior and Lord who is fully Divine and fully Human). I hope this helps. A blessed and spiritually fruitful Lent to all.




Around The World Global Awareness

WORLD HUNGER

As part of your family's Lenten fasting, consider eating simple meals and donating the money you would normally spend on a family dinner to your CRS rice bowl, to your parish food pantry, or to a local food bank.

The following are three suggestions to help raise your family's awareness of those through out the world and in your own community who do not have enough food to eat.

1. Almost two-thirds of the world lives on a diet composed mostly of rice and beans. One Lenten evening, have a meal consisting on only these two items. Talk about what family members know about people around the world. Talk about the need for peace and justice for people of all races, colors, and beliefs. End the meal with a prayer for freedom from poverty, hunger, war, and oppression around the world and in your own community.
2. Have a similar meal on another Lenten evening. Again prepare some of the staples of the Third World - rice, beans, pita or tortillas, and the like. During the course of this meal, talk about places in the world where there is suffering. You may want to share a couple of articles from the newspaper or from your diocesan paper or parish bulletin. When the meal is finished, again pray for those who suffer from hunger, poverty, war, and oppression of any kind.
3. On a third Lenten evening, set pictures of the poor and oppressed on your dining table. Again serve the staples of the Third World. Talk about people in the world who hunger and places in the world where there is suffering. At the end of the meal, pray for all the people and places you have mentioned. As a family, decided on one practical way you can help the poor and hungry in your community and/or in the world.

The Invitation

Dear Parishioners,

Lent is a pilgrimage which Christ personally invites us to make. This journey is not just for a few hours of carrying ashes on our foreheads, but rather an invitation to follow Jesus more closely. First, we will encounter the ministry, sacrifice and resurrection Jesus undertook for us. Second, we are invited to face ourselves. This journey is no place for falsehood. During Lent we are guided by the Spirit of God to look at things that ultimately matter and to leave in the ashes those things blocking our full participation in the life God is giving us. You are invited to explore the opportunities our parish is offering during Lent. Needless to say, our journey this year will be different because of COVID, but that doesn't diminish the power of the Spirit to draw us more closely to Jesus Christ and to each other to bring the message of mercy and hope to everyone.

Official Lenten Regulations

For this penitential season, the Church draws on the wisdom of the Scriptures and tradition in suggesting a time of intense prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Abstinence: On days of abstinence eating of meat is not allowed. Catholics in the United States are obliged to abstain on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays during the season of Lent. Catholics are also obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Self-imposed observance of fasting on all weekdays of Lent is strongly recommended, as is abstinence from meat on all Fridays of the year.

Fasting: On a day of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal the other full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are permitted. The obligation of fasting binds Catholics who are 18 - 59 years old. The obligation of abstinence applies to those 14 years and older. The law does not oblige when health or ability to work would be seriously affected.



ALMSGIVING: PARTICIPATE IN CRS RICE BOWL!

Our parish participates in CRS Rice Bowl, an educational and formation Lenten program, as a way to encounter Jesus through others, especially through the most vulnerable in our world. This year, Rice Bowls will be mailed

to every household along with the Lenten Black booklets. Please be sure to use the resources to deepen your Lenten experience, including the recipes. Your prayers, fasting and almsgiving this Lenten season will help Catholic Relief Services continue to provide life-saving assistance in over 100 countries and will also benefit local hunger-reduction programs. CRS works on our behalf to care for the poorest in our world and to end global poverty. *Be sure to visit www.crsricebowl.org for more information about this year's program, including recipes for your Lenten meals.*
