

Pastor's Page



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As all are aware, the safety measures we've been observing to try and ensure everyone's protection from the COVID-19 pandemic have begun to be relaxed, and even eliminated. The wearing of masks and face coverings, while still strongly encouraged, are now optional and not required. All sorts of commercial and recreational activities are returning and gaining momentum. Catholic Churches and other Christian and religious communities have begun to restore at least some of the worship practices that have been prohibited or drastically curtailed for so many long months now.

As the State of Washington "reopens" from the pandemic closures, the Archdiocese of Seattle is also getting word out to assist Catholic parishes with regard to celebrations of the Mass. While these new steps do represent a gradual move toward restoring at least some pre-pandemic practices, we must also remember that COVID-19 is still present in all our communities, and therefore care, prudence and pastoral discretion must guide us as we continue forward. Here are some changes that we can begin to embrace over the course of the next couple of months:

NOW

- Masks are **strongly** encouraged, but no longer required.
- People are to screen themselves for COVID-19 symptoms.
- Registration for Mass will not be required.
- Communion may be received in the hand or on the tongue, but both methods require care and adherence to safety measures on the part of the person receiving.

JULY 24th & 25th

- Return of Holy Water to baptismal fonts and blessing stations.
- The Sign of Peace may be exchanged via physical contact—e. g., a handshake.
- The Presentation of the Gifts will once again be done by the faithful.

AUGUST 28th & 29th

- Children's Liturgy of the Word may return.
- Congregational singing may be allowed and encouraged.

Some matters will remain unchanged until further notice, such as the dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass, the Precious Blood will not be distributed to the laity, the livestreaming of Mass will continue, and no "close contact" gatherings will be permitted either before or after Mass.

As we make these changes, let us remain careful to protect and respect one another, and to maintain the reverent and welcoming atmosphere that has always been our goal for the liturgies at OLG.


How do you know each of these people is a person? (Some possible responses: everyone has a body, a name, a family etc.)

As followers of Jesus, we show our love for God by how we treat our families, friends, and others. We believe that God is present in each of us.

Reflection Questions to discuss as a family:

- Have each member say one special thing about each family member.
- We know God created all the unique things about each of us, so we treat one another with love and dignity. List five ways each member can show someone respect.
- In our at OLG, we have members who come from many wonderful different cultures and traditions. As a family, can you name the different cultures and traditions we have at OLG?
- How can you show your love and respect for these different cultures and traditions? Talk about how you as a family can participate in the wonderful cultural traditions we have at OLG this year to learn more about them.

Archdiocese of Seattle Bishops Express Sorrow for Native Americans

Seattle, Wash., July 6, 2021 – Today we wish to address our Native American brothers and sisters. While we recognize that each individual tribe in our own archdiocese and across the continent has had a differing experience with the Catholic Church, we wish to acknowledge the real pain that our Native American brothers and sisters are feeling at this time.

The recent discovery of the unmarked children's graves in Canada is heartbreaking, not only for those nations but for all people. We wish to stand in solidarity with them as the story behind these graves comes to light.

In the Archdiocese of Seattle, we have had a long history with our Native American brothers and sisters. Our relationship with different tribes over time has been both positive, and sadly, potentially harmful at times. To better understand our own history and ensure continued openhearted relationships with all the tribes, we will be partnering with our Native American Advisory Board. This group of leaders from several regional tribes will help guide our efforts moving forward. We wish to thank them in advance for their partnership and their willingness to share their gifts of time and talent.

We are all children of God, connected to each other and the world around us. We ask everyone to pray for the healing and strength of our Native American brothers and sisters - and for each other. We continue to pray for you as we stand in solidarity with everyone who has been harmed by the Church.






Yoshino's Teriyaki Sauce For Sale!!


