

#### WHAT IS THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK?

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is one of the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church. Like the sacrament of reconciliation (confession), it is a sacrament of healing. Our understanding of this sacrament has changed with time. In the early Church, it was seen as a sacrament of healing, but later it came to be known as "Extreme Unction" - literally, "last anointing" - and was not administered until death was imminent. With the reforms of the Second Vatican Council, the Church has returned to the more ancient practice with regard to this sacrament. For more information, go to our website: www.olgseattle.org.




