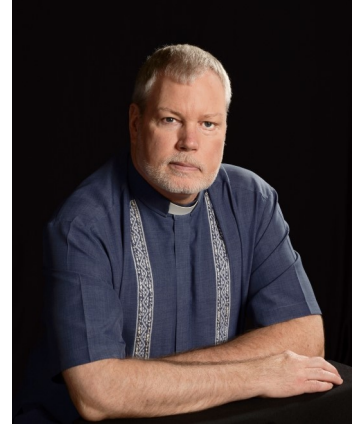

## *Pastor's Page*



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

After a brief hiatus for a couple of weeks while I was out of action and away from the parish due to my recent eye surgery and recuperation, I have returned to active duty, but am still in “Catch-up Mode” as I tend to things that piled up during my absence somewhat. It is good to be back, and I am grateful for the many prayers and expressions of support and encouragement that OLG parishioners and staff members offered on my behalf. They really did help to get me through.

The eye-surgery was successful, but it did leave me looking like I had been on the losing side of a drunken bar brawl. (I want to assure you that I was NOT drunk!) Seriously, the bruising, swelling and blood-shot appearance that I had following the surgery was much more pronounced than I expected, and lasted a good deal longer than I thought it would. However, day by day and bit by bit the healing has improved, and my post-op meeting with the surgeon went extremely well, with him telling me that I need not come back to see him again until August.

And so, it is back to the future for me as, with all of you, I move forward with the celebrations of Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christ and the Masses of the summer period of Ordinary Time approaching and upon us. In addition, we are anticipating some degree of change in the features of our public Masses here at OLG as the numbers of those having received their COVID vaccinations increases. What this will look like in specific detail is not yet known, but as we receive instruction and guidance from our civil authorities and from our Catholic bishops we will pass them on to you and begin to implement them with you. Everyone’s safety continues to be our prime concern, but we do want to take advantage of whatever options and permissions are given to us. We also want to make sure that, as we move forward, we do so in ways that are both charitable and mutually supportive. More to come on this as we are given the guidelines and practices to follow.

In closing, I wish to extend my sincerest congratulations and esteem to all the students and educators here at OLG—the 8<sup>th</sup> graders at OLG School, the seniors at our Catholic and our public high schools, and any college students completing their degree programs, together with all the teachers and administrators who have assisted and mentored them in the studies they undertook this year. This COVID year has been especially challenging, to say the least, but it appears as if you have faced it and gotten through it in ways that give you credit. My applause and my prayers are offered for you all.

#### Summer Series

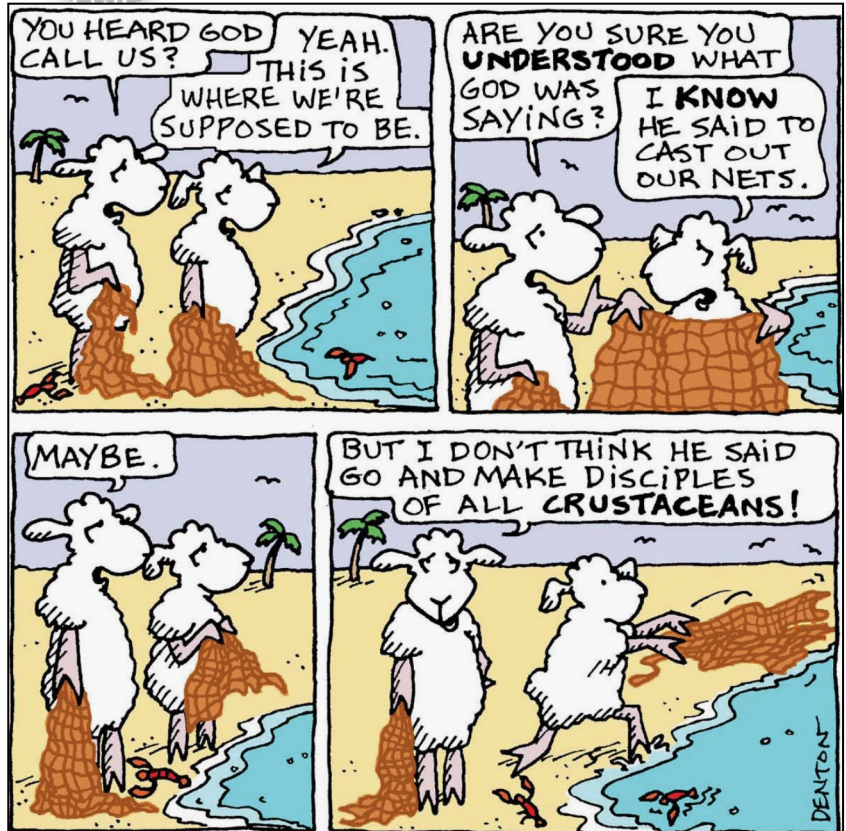
#### Reflection Activity:

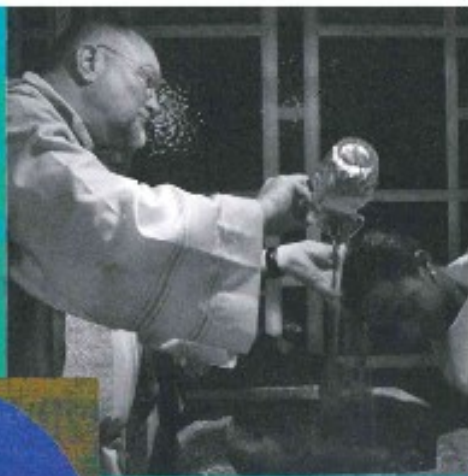

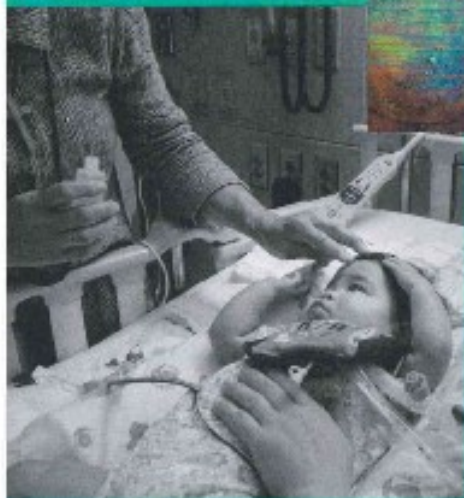

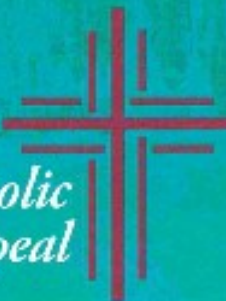

### Catholic Relief Services: Providing Water in Rwanda

CRS has been working with USAID to help our brothers and sisters in Rwanda get access to clean water. In one village, USAID and CRS have dug 61 boreholes in 7 districts that provide water close by. That means children, often responsible for collecting water, are not at risk of missing school or not having enough time for homework. In addition, CRS installed two solar-powered deep wells in the Kayonza and Ngoma Districts, powering the delivery of clean, safe drinking water in those villages.
