

Pastor's Page



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As October draws to a close and November draws near, a vitally important annual matter is brought to our attention for our prayerful reflection and our faith-filled response. This is the time of year when all Catholic parishes and faith communities in the Archdiocese of Seattle (the Catholic Church of Western Washington) are asked to reflect upon and (re)commit themselves to the practice of “stewardship” regarding their financial support for the pastoral mission and communal life that Christ himself has called us to build and share.

It is hugely important to remember that this “stewardship of treasure” is only one aspect of the larger reality of stewardship that pertains to our whole way of life as disciples of Jesus Christ. Stewardship in this sense includes the loving and responsible sharing of our time and our talents as well as our treasure. Stewardship entails the recognition that everything we have and all that we are ultimately comes from God, and that our lives and our gifts are meant to be received gratefully, cultivated wisely, shared lovingly and returned with increase.

Our annual fall Stewardship of Treasure appeal is especially important this year, primarily due to the increasingly harmful impact of the COVID pandemic upon our ordinary income—i.e., the size of the collections from our weekend Masses. COVID has been a challenge for us all, and while we have thus far been able to hold our own due to the generous support of our parishioners, economic trends and giving patterns indicate that we are likely to face a far more noticeable downturn in our ordinary income this year as a parish community. For this reason, we ask everyone to please be as generous as you can in the pledge you make for this year’s Stewardship of Treasure appeal. If you have not been practicing this dimension of the call to stewardship, won’t you please begin? If you have regularly donated to our Stewardship of Treasure campaign each year, we humbly ask you to increase your contribution, if you can. Let us keep alive the generous legacy of stewardship that has built, maintained, and progressively enhanced the life and mission of Our Lady of Guadalupe Church from its founding in 1960—its Catholic school, its parish ministries and programs, its outreach and services, its Christian witness and compassionate care. If we all do our part, we can make it.

May the pledges we make in this year’s Stewardship of Treasure offer clear signs that we are a people who truly love God with all our heart and mind and soul and strength, and that we truly love our neighbors as ourselves.

Family Faith Formation Dia de los Muertos

The Catholic Church in Mexico has moved Día de los Muertos to coincide with All Saints on November 1, dedicating that day to the children who have died. November 2nd, All Souls Day, is dedicated to the adults who have died. These are days for festivity, not somberness, and they include costumes, special foods, celebrations at church, and gatherings at cemeteries.

Family Activity



Create a family altar for Día de los Muertos (Day of the Dead). Select a few pictures of family members who have died, and images of special Saints and of the Virgin Mary.

Place these on the altar, adding candles (battery operated are good with children), flowers, and the traditional skull-and-skeleton-shaped candies. Gather as a family to offer memories of and prayers for your deceased members in your family.

Ditty Bag Stuffing Party




