Dear Friends in Christ,

With the Christmas season concluding this Sunday with our celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, and simultaneously beginning the period of Ordinary Time, we offer our most sincere expression of gratitude to the many people and groups who made our Christmas season so beautiful and prayerful, especially in connection with our celebrations of the Masses for the Nativity of the Lord on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day; the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God on New Year's Day; the Feasts of the Holy Family, of the Epiphany of the Lord and of the Baptism of the Lord. 


Ministry Fair Has Been Postponed Until Fall
