



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As Advent progresses and unfolds, Christmas draws nearer and nearer. One of the great motifs of Advent is the call to repentance and the offer of mercy. Remember, for example, the ministry of John the Baptizer, he who was the herald and forerunner of Christ, and how John called everyone to repentance and baptized them in the Jordan River for the forgiveness of their sins.

This coming week we will be celebrating, here at OLG, our annual Advent Communal Reconciliation Services on Wednesday, December 15th, at 7:00 p.m., and on Saturday, December 18th, at 10:00 a.m. For those who wish, I will be available, after each of these communal services, to hear private, individual confessions and to offer sacramental absolution. I will also be available to hear confessions and give absolution on Friday, December 17th, at 5:30 p.m., and on Wednesday morning, December 22nd at 10:00 a.m. (following morning Mass). Confessions will also be heard on Saturday afternoons at 4:15 p.m., as usual. I encourage everyone to come and prayerfully experience a deeper sense of God's mercy and peace through one of these celebrations.

Also, just to make sure that everyone is aware of the change that this year's Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses will have on our regular weekend Mass schedule, please be sure to note that there will be no 5:30 p.m. Vigil Mass for the Feast of the Holy Family on Saturday evening, December 25th. The 10:00 a.m. Mass on Christmas Day will be the only Mass celebrated on that day/date at OLG.

I hope and pray that our Advent liturgical celebrations, both of the Eucharist and of Reconciliation, will help us all to know the grace and mercy of God in deeper and more tangible ways during this Advent Season, and that this gift will grow and endure as we move through the Christmas season and into the coming New Year.





COP 26 through the Eyes of the Church

Wednesday, December 15
7pm—8pm via Zoom



Last month, the United Kingdom hosted the 26th United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP26). World leaders gathered in Glasgow, Scotland to work for the preservation of our planet. Many vowed to cut greenhouse gases and other emissions in an effort to stem the devastating effects of the climate crisis.

“There is a nobility in the duty to care for creation through little daily actions, and it is wonderful how education can bring about real changes in lifestyle.” - Laudato Si’ 211

In his encyclical *Laudato Si’*, Pope Francis calls us toward sustainability in the spirit of integral ecology. Our world leaders, our neighborhoods and our own families are called to learn and grow together to take action that is urgently needed.

To better understand COP 26 from a faith perspective, Brian Roewe, environmental correspondent for the *National Catholic Reporter*, and Jeff Renner, Emmy-winning meteorologist, will offer their reflections. Mr. Roewe, who attended the first week of COP 26, will help us understand what happened in Glasgow and how the work of the conference impacts us as Catholics. Mr. Renner will address the effects that global discussions have on our local community, which has already seen an astonishing change in the weather during these last few weeks. Together, they will share how they discuss the climate crisis, even in challenging settings.

They will then be responsible to accurately summarize these listening efforts and submit to the Archdiocese of Seattle for further reporting to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and subsequently to the Vatican.

We are happy to announce that Cindy Tewes and Nicole Monroe are our Parish Coordinators. In December, they, along with some parish staff, will receive training from the Archdiocese which will help them to help lead our parish in this important effort.

YEAR END GIVING TIPS

The end of December is also the end of the tax year. Here are some tips for year-end giving.

- New donation –
 - [Donate Online](#)
 - Text 206-745-4559 and put \$\$ amount in message line - response will provide link to finalize gift.
 - Mail or drop off at parish office.
- IRA – If you are 70 ½ or older, there are potential tax benefits when you transfer funds from your IRA to the parish. Contact your IRA plan administrator.
- Donate stock – donating to a non-profit can save you from paying capital gains tax of the appreciated value if you've held the stock for at least year. Call 206-382-4845 for further instructions/details on donating stock.

To be counted as a tax deduction for 2021 your gift must be either received or postmarked by December 31st. If the parish receives it after January 1st, the IRS says it is a 2022 tax deductible gift.


