



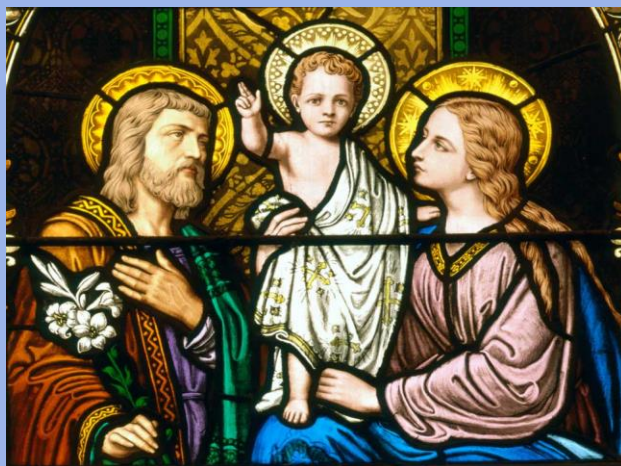

This is a wonderful story and one that resonates with every family. Children and teenagers can relate to sometimes being lost, physically or spiritually, and parents can relate to feeling anxiety and concern for their children. This story is also about the example that parents give to their children about their worship of God and about a child's realization that God's work can be done even by the very young. In the end, it is about the need for all of us to advance in wisdom, age, and grace with the help of God, no matter how old we are. The bible does not tell us about Jesus' childhood, except that he grew in "wisdom and age and favor before God and man."

Family Faith Sunday is a multi-generational program where parents/guardians and their children (K-8th) gather to pray, play, and share their faith in community with other families in a fun way!

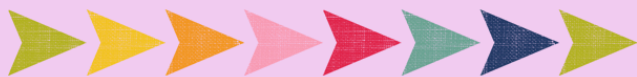


December 6 – Feast of St. Nicholas Day

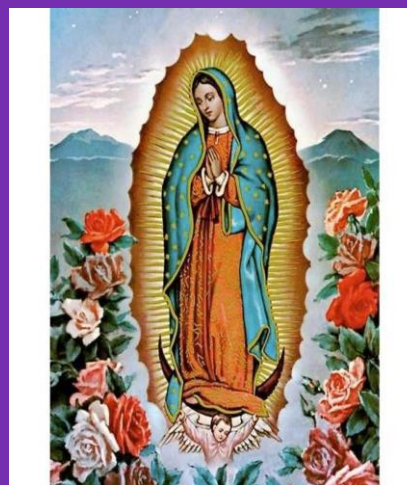

Our Lady of Guadalupe: North America, South America

According to tradition, Mary appeared to Juan Diego, who was an Aztec, convert to Christianity. On December 9th and again on December 12th, 1531. During her first apparition, she requested that a shrine to her be built on the spot where she appeared, on Tepeyac Hill. The bishop demanded a sign before he would approve construction of a church, however, Mary then appeared a second time to Juan Diego and ordered him to collect roses. In a second audience with the bishop, Juan Diego opened his tilma, letting dozens of roses fall to the floor to reveal, the image of Mary imprinted on the inside of his tilma. This image of Mary is now venerated in the Basilica of Guadalupe.
