
"Mind-Control: Fact or Fiction?"

People of the Past

In 1908 the Bartlett family left Pennsylvania and moved to Gaither Mountain in Boone County, Arkansas. They filed a homestead claim for 160 acres near the Hill Top post office. Tom Bartlett's sister, Nelle Bartlett, visited the family on Gaither Mountain and realized it was an ideal place to establish a mission school. She placed a request to the Presbyterian Church Headquarters in Pittsburgh, PA. Her petition was granted and the Hill Top Mission School was born. Mrs. Mae Bartlett was matron over the girls division and Mr. Tom Bartlett was the farm manager. This school was similar to the present day College of the Ozarks.
