The fiction, nonfiction, poetry, and drama presented in The Literature of the Ozarks complicate assumptions about back woods ignorance, debunk the pastoral myth, expand on the meaning of wilderness, and position the Ozarks as a crossroads of human experience with meaningful ties to national literary movements.

Birth: 18 September 1899 Batavia, Boone County, Arkansas

Death: April 1964 Harrison, Boone County, Arkansas

Parents: Amsley and Victoria (Roberts) Case Spouse: Nola Mae McFerrin married 14 May 1921

Children: Betty and Larry Case

Education: Berryville, Arkansas school system

Religion: First Christian Church

Case followed in his father, Amsley's, footsteps choosing a career in photography. His father was a photographer during the tin-type era. Case opened his photography studio at Harrison in 1924 and worked until his sudden death from a heart attack in 1964. Happy 150th Birthday, Boone County! Boone County was created April 9, 1869 from a large part of Carroll County and a narrow strip of Marion County. Boone County contains 604 square miles. Harrison was incorporated in 1876. Some Boone County townships were established long before the county was created: Bear Creek, Crooked Creek, Long Creek, and Sugarloaf, just to name a few.
