

People of the Past

Dee Brown



Brown's father died when he was five years old; his mother moved Brown and his siblings to Stephens, Arkansas where she became the local postmaster. In 1924, the family moved to Little Rock where Brown attended Little Rock High School. While living in Little Rock, Brown admired a Native American baseball player for the Arkansas Travelers. (This player would often throw baseballs to the kids that could not afford tickets to the games.)

After graduating high school in 1927, Brown relocated to Harrison, Arkansas where he gained employment as a printer and journalist for the Harrison Daily Times. While living in Harrison, Brown borrowed a Model T car to take a drive to Jasper. During his visit to Jasper, a bank was robbed; Brown was falsely accused of the crime. He spent the night in the Newton County jail. The next day, he discovered the man who falsely accused him had stolen the tires to the borrowed Model T. In 1928, Brown left Harrison and enrolled at Arkansas State Teachers College (University of Central Arkansas.) He graduated in

1931 with a Bachelor of Arts and Education Degree with a major in History. He then began a long career as a professional librarian. Brown used his education and admiration of the Native Americans towards writing award winning novels. His book, Bury My Heart at Wounded Knee, sold over 5 million copies world wide. Brown stated the best compliment he ever received for this book was from a Native American: "You didn't write that book. Only an Indian could have written that book!"
