

The four-legged creature only has 39 percent accuracy, according to Stormfax Almanac's data. Phil sees his shadow about 85 percent of the time. A look at records dating back to 1887, when the tradition started, show Phil has seen his shadow 103 times and hasn't seen it just 18 times. There are nine years that weren't reported.

February 19: Crocheting 101 with MaryAnn Kaffenberger. Learn the basics of crocheting.


February 26: Amazing Race: Library Edition at 4 p.m.


February 21: Meet George and Martha Washington. We will be welcoming our guest speakers and traveling back in time to meet our first president and his wife.
