### **Family Scheduling Preference and Indicator C1 (Timely Initiation of Services)**

#### **A Scenario**

*It's Tuesday, April 29, 2025. The IFSP team is wrapping up its meeting at a family's home. The team has identified outcomes and goals and determined that DS twice per month would be the ideal service to address the family's priorities and concerns.*

*"Tuesday mornings only, please; I work Wednesday through Saturday, and Sundays and Mondays are my catch-up time," mom says. The service coordinator makes note of this and promises to do her best to find a provider who can see the child and family on Tuesdays.*

*Within a day or two the local system identifies a provider who has availability on Tuesdays beginning in early June. Perfect! A little past the 30-day timeline... but it's what the family wants... right? The service coordinator informs the family that the provider will arrive at their home at 10:00AM on June 10<sup>th</sup> for the first DS visit.*

*When the first service contact note is entered, TRAC-IT recognizes the June 10<sup>th</sup> service date as outside of the required "30-day timeline" and prompts for a reason for the delay. The user selects "family scheduling preference" and moves on to another task.*

#### **What's Right?**

The local system has been able to accommodate the family's preference for a specific weekday and time. *Nice!*

#### **What's Wrong?**

There's no documentation to show the system *could've* provided the service within the 30-day timeline—just not on a Tuesday. Could a family's "preference" obscure system capacity issues?

## **The Fix**

Document the availability of DS sessions within the required timelines, and offer those sessions to the family (and document this, too). For example:

*Called mom to say I've found a DS provider (Betty Rubble) who can accommodate Tuesday mornings starting on June 10<sup>th</sup>. Reminded mom that Part C services are required to begin within 30 days of signing the IFSP, and that another provider (Wilma Flintstone) could come sooner—on 5/8, 5/9 or 5/14, none of these a Tuesday. Mom confirmed she understood and added that she'd love to start sooner, but it just has to be Tuesdays.*

## **Summary**

Trying to accommodate a family's preference of provider, day, time, etc., is definitely commendable and encouraged whenever feasible. But when that preference causes a timeline to be exceeded, *there must be documentation to support that the system had the capacity to provide a service within timelines*. Without it, the delay cannot be unquestionably attributed to family scheduling preference.

## **Related: Can families “waive” the 30-day-timeline requirement?**

No. A family can choose to have an initial service provided beyond the required 30-day timeline if doing so better aligns with the family's schedule or other needs *and* after being offered one or more service dates and times within Part C timelines. But no, families do not “waive” their rights to timely service delivery (or any other Part C requirement), and a family's choice to begin services beyond 30 days shouldn't be documented as “they waived their right to...”.
