## Did you know???

As of early 2025, Detroit has made a lot of progress in helping veterans who are experiencing homelessness. Right now, about 100 veterans in the city don't have stable housing, and around 11 of them are living without shelter.

This is a big improvement from 2017, when there were 348 homeless veterans in Detroit ([link to source](#)).

Please read below to learn about the help and services available for veterans who are experiencing homelessness.

## Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF)

SSVF is a federally funded program that provides rapid re-housing and homelessness prevention services to very low-income veteran families. Services include outreach, case management, and assistance in obtaining VA and other benefits.

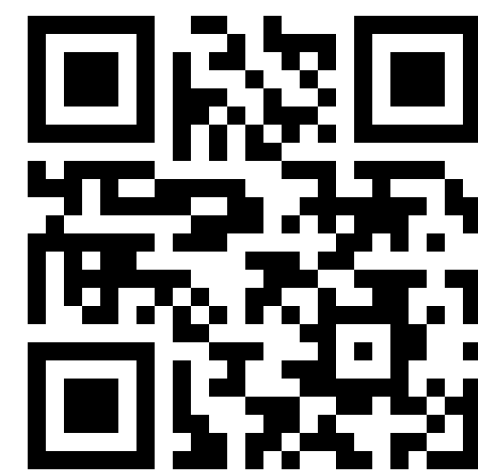
# VETERAN RESOURCES

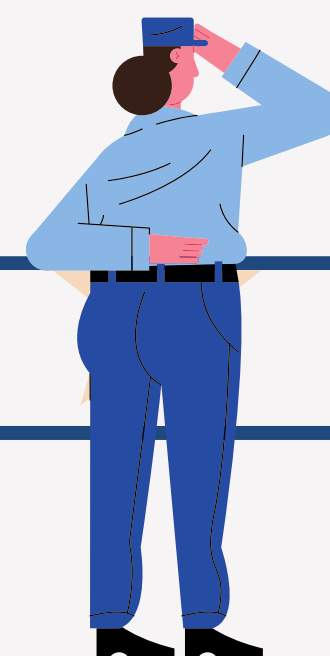
## Michigan Veterans Foundation (MVF)
