SER Metro-Detroit's Year-Round Youth Program is funded by DetroitAtWork under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). The program provides comprehensive year-round services for youth ages 16-24. Young adults in Detroit can take advantage of job services, career coaching, and free training if eligible.

The program focuses on academic enrichment, tutoring and mentoring activities, leadership training and career guidance and counseling. The programs' goal is to improve the long-term employment prospects of young people by providing:
