



Dr. Klein is a Board-certified Associate Professor of Radiology at the Medical College of Wisconsin and Section Chief of Neuroradiology. His clinical and research interests include functional brain mapping, traumatic brain injury, cognitive neuroimaging, and 7 Tesla magnetic resonance imaging. He has received federal, industry, and institutional grant funding for his research projects and was Co-Principal Investigator for a study funded by GE Healthcare and the NFL investigating advanced magnetic resonance imaging applications for mild traumatic brain injury.
