SPIRE Hosts Kenyan Union of Savings and Credit Co-operatives

Falcon Heights, MN Through a partnership with the Minnesota Credit Union Network (MnCUN), SPIRE recently had the opportunity to host 30 representatives from 12 credit unions in Kenya, where they are known as Savings and Credit Co-operatives, or SACCOs.

The visit, coordinated with the World Council of Credit Unions (WOCCU), was a program designed to explore the operational environment of credit unions in the United States and witness first-hand how they serve and support their communities.
