



## PATIENT-CENTERED MENTAL HEALTH IN PEDIATRIC PRIMARY CARE PROGRAM

The *Patient-Centered Mental Health in Pediatric Primary Care Program* is a nationally recognized and evidence-based program that trains pediatric physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, and other PCPs to become confident in diagnosing and treating mental health conditions. You will learn about common pediatric mental health disorders, along with psychopharmacology, assessment tools, and coding and billing.

PCPs will leave the training with assessment tools, diagnostic guidelines, and quick-reference medication guides to help integrate behavioral health care into their primary care practice.

CMEs will be awarded following the in-person training session. The training also includes a 4-month case-based follow up program. 8 twice-monthly, one-hour collaborative learning calls with the REACH Institute training staff will follow the initial training and additional CMEs will be awarded.
