## INCENTIVES FOR ATTENDING

Health Centers and their providers who complete all necessary pre-clinical work, all required surveys, and attend all sessions will receive compliance credit for this year's FTCA Redeeming and Deeming Applications in the following areas:

### 1. Risk Management Annual Required Trainings

- a. OB/GYN certificate
- b. Sterilization and Infection Control certificate
- c. HIPAA certificate

### 2. Quarterly Risk Assessments

- a. Risk assessments will be provided as pre-clinical work. Session attendance along with the completed assessment will count as compliance credit for all 4 quarters of the quarterly risk assessments that must be submitted with this year's application.

### 3. Risk Management Report to the Board

- a. Health Centers will have the opportunity to do pre-clinical work that will assist with completing the annual risk management report that must be submitted with this year's application. The session will focus on using the HRSA approved report template which captures all the necessary information required to demonstrate compliance.

Attendees will learn how to establish an ongoing risk management program along with lots of other tips and tricks for submitting a complete and successful application.
