	<p>a) Covid Protocols – Communication released on September 22, 2022, by Madam Supreme Basileus Danette Anthony Reed regarding updated COVID Protocols. Effective October 1, 2022, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated returned to pre-pandemic “normal” operations. This means:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">(1) No COVID restrictions(2) No vaccination mandates(3) Wearing mask is optional and at the discretion of each individual soror <p>b) Committee presented a motion that was passed by the Executive Board regarding background checks. There are 2 types of background checks:</p> <p>Level I Checks:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Conducted within a state and name-based checks.- Search of individual history and state and local criminal history- Checks if name on national sex offense registry <p>Level II Checks:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Requires fingerprints- Comprehensive background check from FBI and Florida Department of Law <p>Prohibited offenses are cause for being rejected from participating in the program. This could include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Sexual misconduct with disable (including mentally disabled)2. Adult abuse3. Murder, solicitation and conspiracy to commit murder <p>Committee recommended Level II background checks be performed for those sorors who work with the youth programs. Recommendations

Motion – I move that we require a Level II background check for Sorors working with youth programs.

Discussion/Questions

There were several concerns about the criteria for Level II

*Privacy was a very big and alarming concern.

Answer: There will be limited people who would have access to the report due to privacy concerns. It was shared that only 3-4 people would have access to the information of who would work in the programs. It was stated that the agency should red flag Sorors instead if several chapter members have pertinent information about Sorors.

* It was stated that the chapter has always been required to be fingerprinted when working with the youth. There was much discussion from several Sorors. At this time we are out of compliance.

*Soror Marsha Lewis Brown shared that our insurance does require that we make a final decision and reach it after consideration. However, we have very few options. We must address this concern and everyone who works with our youth programs MUST be fingerprinted. We must protect ourselves and the recommendation

	<p>is that we accept the Level II recommendation. This is not a new system. Those who work in the field of health and education must go through this process as well.</p> <p>*The extremely excessive cost of fingerprinting all Sorors working with the youth programs. It was shared that the chapter will incur the cost of the fingerprinting which would be about \$80.00 per individual. The funds are not in the current budget but the matter will be addressed.
