1. **Summer Camp.** You may think you are too old for camp, but there are some designed to appeal to teens, such as digital media camps. Check out the American Camp Association "Find a Camp" directory. Camps are also a great place to find a summer job. Check out the website for the YMCA and other summer camps.

2. **Wilderness Programs.** Check out National Outdoor Leadership School or Outward Bound. You can learn leadership and other skills, including backpacking and wilderness safety.
3. **Museums.** If you are interested in art, look into any local museums. They may have internships or classes for teens.
4. **Volunteer Positions.** Check with your local hospitals about any volunteer programs they may have for teens.
5. **Government Programs.** The mayor's office in your city may provide summer programs for young people. Some are volunteer, some are paid. The police or fire departments may also have programs.
6. **Summer Classes.** Summer is a great time to take classes in what you are most interested in. Many colleges offer specialty classes for teens in computers, art, astronomy, and more.
7. **Check with your local churches.** Many have camps especially for teens and mission trips.
8. **Do It Yourself Summer Jobs.** Maybe you can start your own business—babysitting, dog walking, car washing, tutoring, or lawn mowing can earn you money and skills.

BUG VACUUM

Study insects up close. Scientist capture bugs using a mouth powered vacuum called an aspirator or a pooter. You can make your own version:

Materials

Pint-size mason jar with two-piece lid
Juice or milk carton (paperboard)
Hole Punch
2 bendy straws
Tape
Gauze Pad

Instructions

1. Open the milk carton and flatten it out. Use the inner lid of the mason jar and trace a circle on the carton. Cut out the circle and punch 2 holes in the center, about an inch apart.
2. Slide the short ends of the bendy straws into the holes. Tape a piece of the gauze around the end of one straw to prevent any bugs from getting sucked up.
3. Set the lid on the jar and fasten it with the lid ring.
4. To use: Place the tip of the straw without the gauze near a bug. Put your mouth on the straw with the gauze and gently suck in. The bug should travel up the straw and land unharmed at the bottom of the jar.



MINI ICE CREAM SANDWICH POPS

Ingredients

Regular Size ice cream sandwiches
Colored sprinkles
Lollipop or cookie sticks

Instructions

1. Line a large cookie sheet with wax paper
2. Take one ice cream sandwich from the freezer at a time. Unwrap it and cut it into 3 equal pieces
3. Dip each side of each piece into the sprinkles. You may have to dip each side multiple times or use a spoon to pour on each side and pat down
4. Push the stick into the short end of each sandwich. Place the finished pop of the cookie sheet and return it to the freezer for at least an hour before serving.

2. Grocery Shop. Ask to hold the grocery list for your parents and keep track of the list. Talk about prices, sales and healthy choices.


3. Grow a garden in your yard or in a patio container. Take care of the garden daily and watch the plants grow.
