The big orange acacia at the end of Park Blvd.;
City or Caltrans property; several dead/dying trees

Caltrans property--Much work there a
couple years ago. Acacias dying.

Inside golf course fence, w convenient
hole And parking! Lg. orange tree,
easily seen from Park Blvd.

Bridgeview Trail: many dead
acacia above and below trail

Old Canon Trail, a few
discolored acacia, one
sickly oak

OUSD & PG&E property; viewed only
from distance, many dead acacia

Dense stand of healthy *A. mearnsii*;
a few scattered *A. mel.*, all healthy

Explore: I think there are acacia
here, species not known

Dying acacias reported
along Sunset Trail

2 trees with discolored leaves
seen at 60 mph, recheck

Est. 500 trunks, mostly slender & very tall *A. mearnsii*;
approx 5-10% brown/orange ACAMEL, much tree debris

Several tall dead ACAMEL near Sequoia Pt.
visible from pump track driveway

Sanborn Dr: Most acacia is *A. mearnsii*;
only 2 ACAMEL found, 1 dead, 1 part brown
