ORDER REISSUING AS NEW ORDERS TEMPORARY BLANKET WAIVERS FOR RESIDENTIAL CARE FACILITIES

Pursuant to the “Declaration of Public Health Emergency for Coronavirus Disease 2019 Outbreak” issued by Governor Eric Holcomb on March 6, 2020 as extended and supplemented (the “Governor’s Declaration”) and IC 4-21.5-4-1, and as authorized by IC 16-28-1-10 and the September 18, 1991 resolution of the Executive Board of the Indiana State Department of Health (“ISDH”), the State Health Commissioner hereby **ORDERS** as follows:

1. The “Emergency Order Granting Temporary Blanket Waivers for Residential Care Facilities” originally issued March 20, 2020 is hereby reissued as a new emergency order effective today.
2. The “Second Emergency Order Granting Temporary Blanket Waivers for Residential Care Facilities” originally issued March 21, 2020 is hereby reissued as a new emergency order effective today.
3. The “Emergency Order Authorizing Temporary Personal Care Attendant Positions and Training for Residential Care Facilities” originally issued March 23, 2020 and amended April 2, 2020 and April 8, 2020 is hereby reissued as a new emergency order effective today.
4. The “Third Emergency Order Granting Temporary Blanket Waiver for Residential Care Facilities” originally issued March 23, 2020 is hereby reissued as a new emergency order effective today.
5. The “Fourth Emergency Order Granting Temporary Blanket Waivers for Comprehensive Care Facilities” originally issued April 2, 2020 is hereby reissued as a new emergency order effective today.
6. The “Fifth Emergency Order Granting Temporary Blanket Waivers for Comprehensive Care Facilities” originally issued April 20, 2020 is hereby reissued as a new emergency order effective today.

7. Pursuant to paragraph 13(B) of the Governor's March 19, 2020 Executive Order 20-05, the waivers and actions authorized by this Order shall expire no earlier than the date the Governor's Declaration is withdrawn or expires, including any extensions thereof.
