The [City of Toronto's](#) adoption of category management, which organized procurement around strategic categories, led to impressive results. In 2022, it yielded a combined benefit of \$95.6 million in the categories of construction, technology, and facilities and maintenance. Overall, it achieved an estimated financial benefit during 2022 and 2023 of \$206 million in the form of a combination of cost savings and cost avoidance.
