M.B.I. INFO

Menominee Buffalo Initiative (M.B.I.) in partnership with The Nature Conservancy will be traveling to conduct a traditional harvest at Nacusa Grasslands, a buffalo prairie preserve located in Illinois. Although our traditional ceremonial practices indicate we understood the great significance of this relative, we acknowledge that buffalo were not at the center of our Menominee culture in the earliest writings, yet their relevance is without question. Archeology sites provide evidence that Pesaehkiw once migrated in massive numbers across the prairie lands that existed in what we today call Wisconsin. During the expansion of colonization and tribes being forcefully removed from their homelands, buffalo were nearly wiped out to remove the food source and our lands were opened up to homesteads. Today, there are many movements, like ours, across Indian country making great efforts to restore buffalo back into our lands and communities to help us reconnect our life ways with creation.
