“Come, to know the love of God: Go, to make it known.”



Grace and peace to you from God our Creator and Jesus the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. Jesus has many names throughout the gospels. Jesus is referred to as Alpha and

Omega, Immanuel, King of Kings, Light of the World, Morning Star, Prince of Peace, Wonderful Counselor, Lamb of God, Savior of the World, Good Shepherd, The Way, Lord of Lords, Anointed One, Bread of Life, Chief Cornerstone, Great High Priest, Messiah, Teacher, Rabbi, Truth, Word of God, Son of God, Son of Man, and King of the Jews. This month we celebrate not only Jesus being Christ the King of all, but then quickly rewind to the beginning as we await the coming birth of Emmanuel, God with us.

Our church year ends on the promise of Christ the King Sunday, November 20. However, this kingship is different. That is the kingdom that Jesus seeks to bring near to

us. That is the kingdom that through our baptism we are made members of. That is the kingdom that we are charged to bring near as followers of Jesus. That kingdom is what we give thanks for this month. As we gather with family and friends to give thanks for one another let us also remember to give thanks for the King who suffered for us. For the God who sent Jesus into the world for us.

We then reset, we engage with each other by preparing our building for the Advent Season. We prepare during our Advent Day of Serving to care for others during the time of hope and wonder. This season reminds us of a promise that God continually offers us. God sends us Jesus in human form, to a family that wasn't perfect or wealthy, but one that showed humility when faced with this task to raise this child. As they prepare so can we, to welcome this baby, in humbleness, in hope for our future year and our lives together. So let us give thanks to the King who willingly came down to earth to be a King that serves, a King that sacrifices himself for us, and a King that invites us in love to serve one another.



In September our expenses exceeded income by about \$1100.

For the first nine months of the year, income trails expenses by \$28,000.

The General Fund checkbook balance at the end of August was about \$19,400 including the balance of the PPP funds.

Not shown above because it has restricted use is \$6300 in grants for the startup of our After School program. Thanks to Annmarie for working on that.

We are seeing an uptick in rental income. The main sources have been from volleyball and the Hmong congregation. Since March the John-Paul II center has been using our facility two mornings per week for a small group of adults with special needs. It has been a win-win situation and generates additional rental income. We have a great facility and using it more would benefit the community and AELC. If you have any ideas for more rental opportunities, please let the Pastor or council know.

ALL ABOUT FAMILY PROMISE...

In June of 2006, Family Promise of Berks County welcomed their first guest families into the newly formed Interfaith Hospitality Network. Family Promise is a national organization working to help families with children who are experiencing homelessness. Our local network started with 13 different congregations serving as hosts, meaning they would host the families at their churches, providing evening meals, overnight accommodations and breakfast for the families in the program four-times a year. Additional partner congregations would also help with family needs and provide help to some hosts. It took many volunteers to help prepare for host weeks - setting up "bedrooms" in classrooms, preparing meals and eating with the families, overnight hosts who slept at the church to provide a church presence, people who donated breakfast and snack foods for the families as the church became their home for the week. The Family Promise van transported them from the Day Center to the host church in the evening and then back to the Day Center in the morning. This model of housing and feeding families for up to 90 days proved to be very successful in helping families get back on their feet. Then COVID hit! And staying at the churches was no longer an option; so, the organization had to pivot to a new model.

Family Promise worked closely with Berks County leaders and found a way to purchase homes and use them as temporary housing for the homeless families in the program. This is the model in use now and it has worked so well that the plan is to continue it rather than go back to the congregational rotation. So, churches are no longer housing/hosting the families on-site but their partnership is still very important in making the program work. Host congregations have been asked to prepare and deliver meals to the 2 homes just 2 nights each week. Also, items like diapers, paper products and cleaning supplies as well as gift cards are collected for the families. Next month, a third home will be ready to welcome guest families! This will allow FP to serve up to 6 families, 2 in each home if the families are small. Hosts are now being asked to provide and deliver a meal each Monday evening to the 3 locations. The other items and gift cards would still be greatly appreciated as well!

At Allegheny, it has been challenging to get folks to prepare and deliver the meals so I would like to propose something new we can try. Our next host week will begin December 12th.


