"Come, to know the love of God: Go, to make it known."



Grace and peace to you from God our Creator and our Lord and Savior Jesus. As we walk through this season of Lent, it can be easy to get pulled away from our willingness to follow Jesus. The world seeks to quickly pull us from one thing to another, and forget about what is important in our faith lives. As we go through this season, we focus on a few words of the prayer that Jesus taught the disciples and us; "Thy will be done". When we pray this together in worship we ask for God's will to be done, and not ours. We ask for that promise to be with us, and for us to be molded by God to be used to fulfill God's will. Last month I encouraged you to find someone or a group to support you on your Lenten Journey, how is that process going? Are you still searching? Does it seem like just another thing to put on your already busy schedule? Lent reminds us of our need to be in communion with God and others, it reminds us of simplicity, and promises us a closer walk with God. We just need to take the first step with God.

One question that didn't get answered during the Sermon series at the beginning of the year is "did anyone else contribute significantly to the founding of Lutheranism, other than Luther?" Yes, there were several who walked with Luther as he struggled with his faith, and the understandings of the gospel. It wasn't easy, and he didn't do it alone. Johann von Staupitz was the Dean of the faculty at the University of Wit-



tenburg and Luther's spiritual advisor. Johann, who didn't fully understand Luther's direction never stopped loving him. Philipp Melancthon, a professor of Greek at Wittenberg, became an ally of Luther. While they agreed on a great deal, they didn't see eye to eye on everything. Melancthon was considered the peacemaker, and became known by his efforts to share this faithful understanding with all of Germany. There were also many others who challenged Luther, who's views were close but not close enough like, Karlstadt, Zwingli, Calvin and Knox. Why bring this up now? Because as we walk through Lent, it is a reminder that our faith history didn't begin without struggle and antagonism. Our faith fathers' struggled with their decisions, and interpretation of God's word. It was their 'Lenten journey' so to speak where they sought God's will be done. It led to a reforming of the church that still continues today.

And so we continue to seek God's will for us, and for God's church here and now. We follow our faithful leaders of old, and those whom have been entrusted with leadership now, not blindly but continually pursuing God's will to be done, and challenging when necessary. We do this by following a God who promises to walk with us and who invites us to walk humbly down this Lenten Road, together.

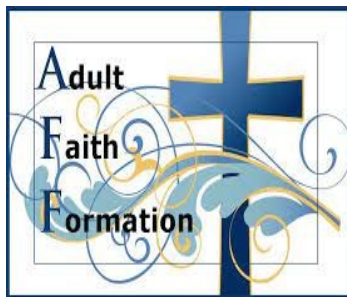

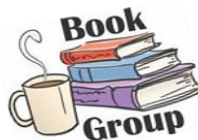

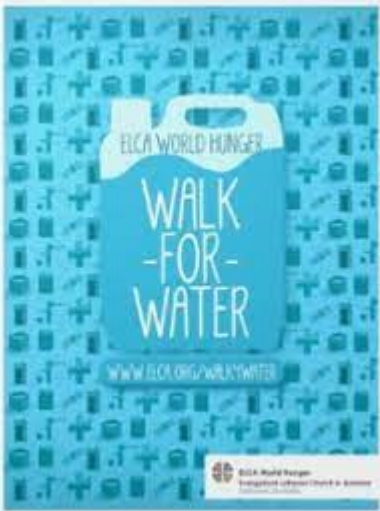
Mini Mission Trip

What would it be like to carry a 5-gallon jug of water (41.5 pounds) just to have water for your family? Did you know:

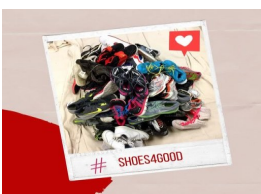
- 768 million people do not have access to improved drinking water sources

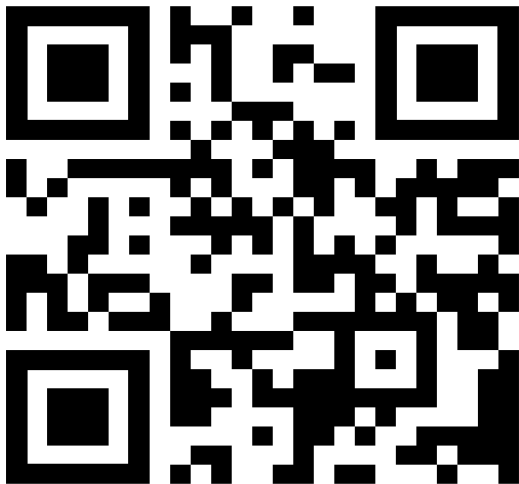

In January, 2023, our expenses exceeded income by \$2800.

The General Fund checkbook balance at the end of January was about \$29,700.

In mid-February the mortgage balance stands at \$23,112 and the Debt Reduction Fund has a balance of \$17,886 to pay down on the principal. That leaves us \$5226 short of being able to pay off the mortgage.

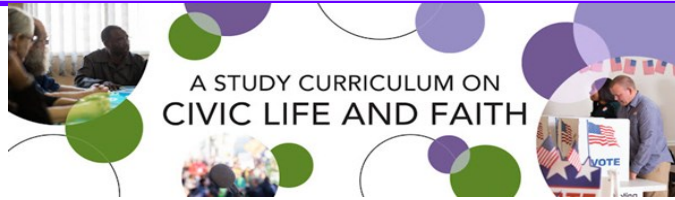
There is a Prayer Request box and slips in the lobby. Feel free to add requests this way; it will be checked weekly. When adding someone to the list, please make sure you have their permission.

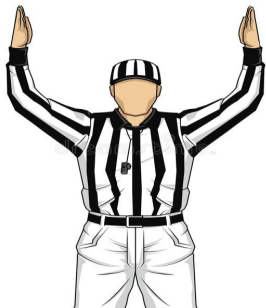

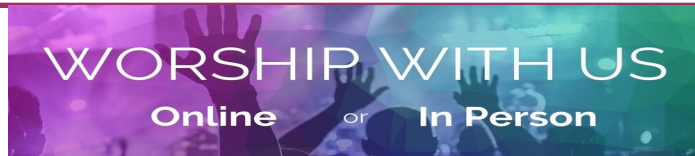
