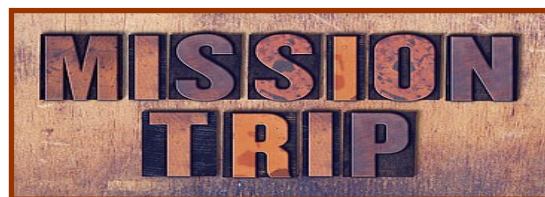
We are excited to welcome her into this role and her family to our community of faith. Help me in welcoming AnnMarie and her family.

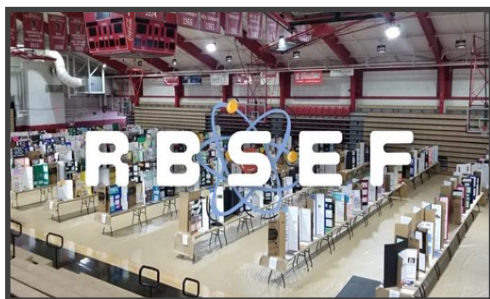
Congratulations, Tim Garmin

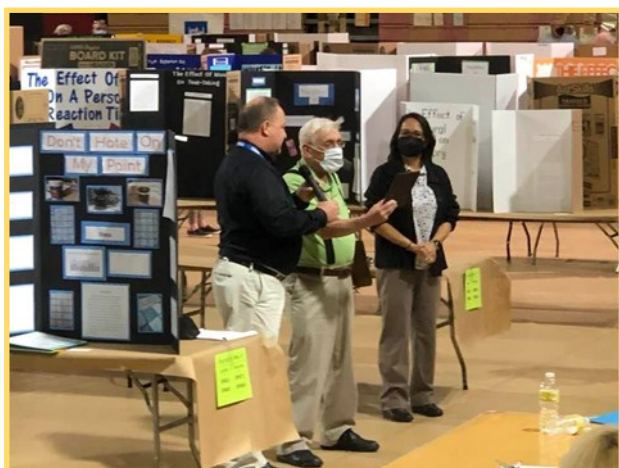

In February our expenses exceeded income by about \$4800. Both income and expenses were below budget.

The General Fund checkbook balance at the end of February was about \$40,700 including the PPP funds.

The HVAC fund balance which is not part of the General Fund is sufficient to cover payments through April. An increase in contributions is needed to cover future payments.

Also, outside of the budget, members continue to contribute to the Debt Reduction Fund and at the end of February we had over \$11,600 to use for our next principal pay-down.

As of the date of this report, **March 21**, you have contributed over \$1500 to the ELCA Lutheran Disaster Response for Ukraine. You have until Easter to contribute. Remember AELC will match up to \$2000 from the Kachel Benevolence Fund and the ELCA will match up to about \$258,000 for the total contributed by ELCA congregations. Your response to these causes is always generous!



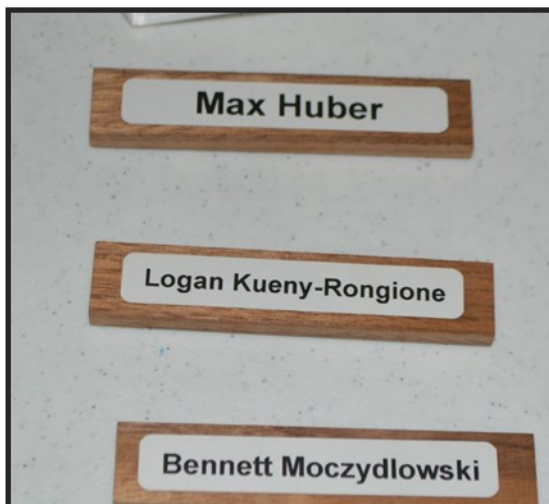
**The 60th Anniversary of the Ordination of

A collection box is in the vestibule for dropping off your used ink cartridges for us to submit to Planet Green Recycling.

If you wish to mail them in yourself from home, please follow the steps below:

- Open the following link on your computer: <http://www.planetgreenrecycle.com/>
- Click on item 2 "Free USPS Label"
- Fill in label request
 - Your first & last name
 - Your email address
 - Organization Program Code: Enter 31821
 - Address – Enter Church Address: 1327 Alleghenyville Rd, Mohnton, PA 19540
 - Identify how many cartridges. **YOU MUST SEND AT LEAST 4**
- You will receive a prepaid label in your email to mail the cartridges
- Box up the cartridges, attach the label and drop off at post office

The church receives funds directly from Planet Green Recycling, \$1.00 for every cartridge (commonly used cartridges). **If you choose to mail in your cartridges yourself, it is very important to make sure to include the church's Organization Program Code (31821) so we receive the credit for the cartridges. No toner cartridges accepted.**
