“Come, to know the love of God: Go, to make it known.”

Christ is Risen, Alleluia!!! These words we profess with joy in the season of Easter. We celebrate our Risen Messiah, the Christ, God’s Word made flesh that comes and dwells among us. It is a promise fulfilled by God that challenges us today, to see the Risen Christ at work in the world. It is a reminder of all that Jesus went through for our sake. It is also a reminder of what God was willing to do, come in flesh, take on something practical, that we can understand, and love. Jesus is the presence of God in the world that allows us to interact personally with God, and helps us understand the Love that God has for humanity.

This presence of God in the world reminds us of our own transformation. Of the Spirit that will soon descend on the first Pentecost, to be shared. That Spirit which is part of us, through faith. The Joy of the resurrection is a gift that for us to share that doesn’t diminish when we give it away. It is a gift much like the loaves and fish, (Matthew 14:17-18-21) that there is always plenty for everyone to have enough to be satisfied. The Love of God is a gift want-

ing and waiting to be given away, freely.




And yes I'm going to say it again. Easter Changes EVERYTHING. This resurrection changes Jesus, it changes the disciples, it changes us, here and now. The God who invites us to walk alongside in humbleness, to share that Love that we have been given with others. So as we continue this joy-filled Easter walk may we be challenged to Love as Jesus loves us, and to share it with humbleness and grace tossing it abundantly about, because the Love of God will never run out.


