"Come, to know the love of God: Go, to make it known."

Grace and peace to you from God our creator and Jesus the infant Christ that we await. Advent is the beginning of the church year and the time of preparation and anticipation of the birth of Jesus. It is a time of renewal and hopeful waiting. However, it's hard to wait, especially when you're excited but uncertain. I cannot imagine the anxiety that Mary and Joseph felt as they prepared for this special and sacred birth. Do you think they had a birth plan? Did they expect to birth the baby at their home? I doubt they expected to have to travel to Bethlehem and to find no one to welcome them. I doubt they were thrilled to have to sleep with the animals, or give birth around them. This humble location, this humble beginning for the Word of God made flesh that comes to dwell among us, is a reminder of God's call for us to be humble.



As we hear of shortages, of needs of workers, of struggling through the wake of the pandemic, how do you see this story differently this year? Are you overwhelmed already by the tasks that present themselves for this Advent Season? Do we respond as Mary full of humbleness and grace: "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed." Or do we struggle with what is going on

around us and seek to respond as Joseph wanting to go back to the way it was and 'let go' of what is put in front of us: "Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit.'"



Perhaps it's somewhere in between? Trusting God but uncertain about what the future has in store? I think that is where the joy and wonder of this season can help us. While we may be uncertain, unsure, angry, full of anxiety, God is at work. God's word made flesh is coming into the world, to dwell among us. To dwell within us, full of grace and truth. What is God doing in this Advent season? Where do you see God dwelling during this season of waiting and anticipation? Perhaps in asking these questions we will see God some place we least expect? In a family who has traveled far, who are weary and exhausted? In a family rejoicing in the birth of a child? A family resting in the only place they can find, a stable? A community rejoicing in the promise anew of God's Word made flesh that comes to save us all in humbleness. A Blessed Advent and Christmas season to you all as we wait with wonder, hope and joy.

Faith Formation

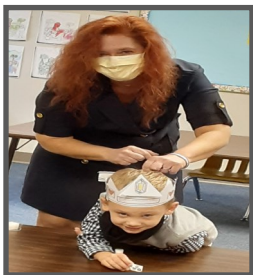
The children were busy making very colorful Stained Glass Soldier Silhouette gifts that were given to our veterans by Pastor Zach on November 14 during worship services.

In October our income exceeded expenses by about \$300. For the first ten months of 2021 expenses exceeded income by \$24,000.

Expenses are \$2400 under budget, but income is \$26,500 under budget.

The HVAC fund balance which is not part of the General Fund is sufficient to cover payments through January. At the end of January, we will have completed two years of our three year loan from the Berks County Community Foundation.

Also, outside of the budget, members continue to contribute to the Debt Reduction Fund and at the end of October we had \$6500 to use for our next principal paydown.



Atonement Lutheran Church (5 Wyomissing Blvd., Wyomissing 19610) is going to try a "Blue Christmas" service for the first time this year. It is called a "Longest Night Service," and it will be held on Tuesday, **December 21** at 7:00 p.m. in the main worship space (not Lundin Hall). Candle lighting, prayers, and readings focused around remembering those we have lost. No sermon or communion. Open to all in the community. Masks are required for all.

Braver Angels: Introductions to Common Ground

This month, the Adult Sunday Faith Formation class wrapped up a 5 week book study of, "The World is About to Turn" by Rick Rouse and Paul O. Ingram. We also had a final Google Meet with one of the authors. Rick Rouse brought up the grassroots organization, Braver Angels.

Following the General Election of 2016, the most divisive election in US History, Better Angels had a main goal of depolarizing the current political landscape in our country. They held their first RED/BLUE conference in December 2016. Their main purpose was to get both sides of political supporters to sit down at the same table and find the commonalities that we have as Americans. In early 2020, they changed their name to Braver Angels:

Braver Angels was inspired by the words of Abraham Lincoln, who not only called on Americans to summon the "better angels" of our nature — but called on us to find the courage needed to pursue a more perfect union, "with malice toward none, with charity for all, with firmness in the right." (<https://braverangels.org/our-story/>)

Braver Angels has a suggested donation of \$12/yr (\$1 month) to join their conversations. I have recently found a lot of my current online conversations through social media will devolve quickly into name calling and meme sharing not based on real facts. Too many times, I have found myself saying the same thing over and over, while no one on either side is listening to each other.

The day after I signed up, one of the co-founders reached out to me. David Lapp is originally from Lancaster County, and was excited to see I was ready to get the conversation started in our area. Braver Angels takes the political leanings of both sides of current issues that cause breakdowns in most online conversations. Initially, members are asked to participate in 1-on-1 dialogues centered around three core topics; Rural/Urban, Generational, or Racial Diversity. Participants are paired according to their political leanings of Red vs. Blue.

My first conversation was with a gentleman from Idaho. We set up an online meeting and had a 1-hour "Getting to know" each other conversation. The questions focus on listening to the other person tell their story. Braver Angels asked us to focus on listening to each other. Then, find the commonalities we share as Americans.

I would like to encourage everyone to visit [BraverAngels.org](https://braverangels.org). Their goals are to embrace the differences we have in this country. There are ways we can engage others without all the name calling and misinformation. Structured conversations reinforce the importance of listening to others and seeing their own issues with a new perspective. We can all work together to strengthen the bonds that make us Americans. We need to work together, to find a common ground that will build us up instead of tearing us apart.

- Fill in label request
 - Your first & last name
 - Your email address
 - Organization Program Code: Enter 31821
 - Address – Enter Church Address: 1327 Alleghenyville Rd, Mohnton, PA 19540
 - Identify how many cartridges. **YOU MUST SEND AT LEAST 4**
- You will receive a prepaid label in your email to mail the cartridges
- Box up the cartridges, attach the label and drop off at post office

The church receives funds directly from Planet Green Recycling, \$1.00 for every cartridge (commonly used cartridges). **If you choose to mail in your cartridges yourself, it is very important to make sure to include the church's Organization Program Code (31821) so we receive the credit for the cartridges. No toner cartridges accepted.**

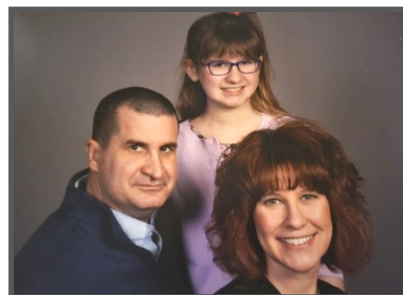
