In March our expenses exceeded income by \$163. Because of there being three paydays in March and some other big bills, it was expected to be a rough financial month. However, we received two annual donations totaling \$10,500 which made it a breakeven month!

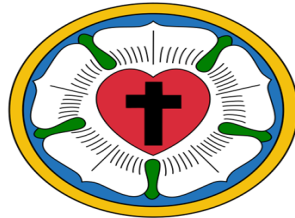
For the first three months of the year, income trails expenses by \$6800.

The General Fund checkbook balance at the end of February was about \$40,500 including the PPP funds.

The HVAC fund balance is not part of the General Fund. As of mid-April, the HVAC balance is only enough to cover the May payment. An increase in contributions is needed to cover future payments.

Also, outside the budget, members continue to contribute to the Debt Reduction Fund and at mid-April we had over \$13,300 to use for our next principal paydown. The treasurer spoke to our contact at the Mission Investment Fund, who agreed again to allow us to paydown on the principal of approximately \$45,000 and have our monthly payments reduced. He congratulated us on how we have handled the debt.

As of the date of this report, April 13th, you have contributed \$2915 to the ELCA Lutheran Disaster Response for Ukraine. \$2000 of matching funds from the Kachel Benevolence Fund gives us a total of almost \$5000. Give yourself a pat on the back.

MORTGAGE PRINCIPAL PAYDOWN OPPORTUNITY

Our mortgagee, Mission Investment Fund, again is allowing us to paydown on the principal of our mortgage which is currently about \$44,700. This will significantly reduce our monthly payments which currently stand at \$1013.

Because of your contributions to the Debt Reduction Fund, we currently have \$13,500 to put toward the paydown. In order to have our monthly payments reduced beginning with the June payment, we must make the paydown payment by mid-May. Therefore, whatever we have collected by May 12th, will be used for the paydown.

As in the past, if you were planning to contribute to the Debt Reduction Fund this year, if you can, it would be most beneficial, to make the contribution prior to May 12th.

Of course, any money received after that is certainly welcomed and will be used for the next paydown which can only occur once per year.

AELC is now using the Planet Green Recycling Program to collect used ink cartridges to send in to recycle and receive money back to be **used in support of the church's Mission Trip program**. A collection box is in the vestibule for dropping off your used ink cartridges for us to submit to Planet Green Recycling.

If you wish to mail them in yourself from home, please follow the steps below:

- Open the following link on your computer: <http://www.planetgreenrecycle.com/>
- Click on item 2 "Free USPS Label"
- Fill in label request
 - Your first & last name
 - Your email address
 - Organization Program Code: Enter 31821
 - Address – Enter Church Address: 1327 Alleghenyville Rd, Mohnton, PA 19540
 - Identify how many cartridges. **YOU MUST SEND AT LEAST 4**
- You will receive a prepaid label in your email to mail the cartridges
- Box up the cartridges, attach the label and drop off at post office

The church receives funds directly from Planet Green Recycling, \$1.00 for every cartridge (commonly used cartridges). **If you choose to mail in your cartridges yourself, it is very important to make sure to include the church's Organization Program Code (31821) so we receive the credit for the cartridges. No toner cartridges accepted.**
