*“Come, to know the love of God: Go, to make it known.”*



AELC is celebrating your achievement (high school, college, or advanced degree) on Graduate Sunday, **June 5** at the 9:30 am service.





# Financial Info

In April our expenses exceeded income by about \$3500.

For the first four months of the year, income trails expenses by \$10,300.

The General Fund checkbook balance at the end of April was about \$37,000 including the balance of the PPP funds.

The HVAC fund balance is not part of the General Fund. As mentioned in last month's newsletter, the balance was running low. You responded and as of mid-May, we have enough to cover June and July payments, but ongoing donations are needed to meet our obligation which ends with the January, 2023, payment.

In mid-May we used \$16,000 from the Debt Reduction Fund to pay down on the principal of our mortgage. Beginning with our June 1<sup>st</sup> payment our monthly payments will be reduced from \$1013 to \$645. After our May payment and the \$16,000 paydown, our original \$800,000 loan has been reduced to \$28,000.
