

Columbarium at AELC

Did you know AELC has a columbarium? Do you know what that is? It's a place where funeral urns can be placed. Instead of purchasing a plot at a cemetery.



Ours sits out the back of Charlie's Café. It is in our memorial garden. A place to remember those we've lost (whether in the columbarium or not), and to be in God's presence.

There have been discussions about making this space more peaceful as well, and we are working on some phased planning for walls, gates, and water features, that give privacy and peacefulness to the setting. Two ways to reach that goal are to have people purchase a niche (\$2000 and \$100 for an urn), as you do your funeral planning, or to donate to the "Memorial Garden." Copies of the movie, **LUTHER, One Man's Faith in God Launched The Greatest Revolution of All** will be available for loan during the course.




AELC MORTGAGE BURNING CELEBRATION

In May, 2023, our income exceeded expenses by \$3600. Income was boosted by a generous annual gift from one of our families.

In June, 2023, our expenses exceeded income by \$6800.

May had the highest monthly income of any month this year, but June had the lowest.

The General Fund checkbook balance at the end of June was about \$13,600.

For the first six months of the year, general fund expenses have exceeded income by \$19,000.

Each year we have two months in which there are three paydays. This year March was one and the second is August which will make August a rough month expensewise.

As of this writing in mid-July, a recaulking preventative maintenance has been completed. The \$8800 cost has been paid for by funds outside of the general fund and is not included in any of the numbers shown in this report. This plus the money used to pay the large HVAC replacement bill earlier this year did put a strain on those funds.

We are always looking for opportunities to make our great facility available for rental to outside organizations and individuals. Currently, we are looking into some possibilities. If you have any ideas, mention them to the pastor or a council member.


