Bishop Scott B. Hayashi Announces Forthcoming Retirement

Dear People of The Episcopal Diocese of Utah:


With the words from Ecclesiastes above, I announce to you that I will be retiring / resigning as your bishop. The Rt. Rev. Todd Ousley, the bishop for pastoral care for The Episcopal Church has already met with The Standing Committee and staff to go over the process of transition.

The date of the election for the new bishop has not been firmly set yet, but it will be held in the spring of 2021, possibly on April 24. The date of the ordination / consecration of the new bishop has been firmly set on the Presiding Bishop's calendar for October 9, 2021, two years from today.

The Standing Committee has authority and oversight of the search and transition process. Information about how this will unfold will be coming from them. I cannot be a part of that process as it would be inappropriate for me to insert myself and try to guide it in any way. I may be consulted along the way but that would be by invitation only.


I pledge to you that I will be diligent in my responsibilities of being your bishop until the ordination of the new bishop of our diocese. Being your bishop has been and continues to be a blessing and joy that I never expected to have in my life. Thank you for this. I ask your prayers for me and Amy as we face into this time. I ask your prayers for our whole diocese and especially the Standing Committee as they navigate the way ahead.



The Rev. Susan Toone to Serve as Vicar at St. Mary's in Provo



St. Mary's Church Provo has a familiar priest as a new Vicar. The Rev. Susan Toone will be the historic church's new cleric. She has served the diocese and Episcopal Community Services as the chaplain to two of the diocesan owned senior centers, St. Mark's Tower and Millcreek St. Mark's. She announced her new position by saying "I'm delighted and honored to answer the call!" The position has been vacant since the retirement and subsequent death of its beloved Vicar, the late Rev. Dr. Peter Van Hook. The Church is known for its music and community service. The Rev. Susan Toone will start





Swords to Ploughshares Event at All Saints

Passionate speeches, music, and the living practice of a 2700 year-old biblical passage combined for a poignant anti-gun violence service at All Saints in Salt Lake City. The diocese and the Gun Violence Prevention Center of Utah sponsored the beating of guns into garden tools on October 5th. The concept dates back to Isaiah and the beating of swords into ploughshares.

Fred Martin and Mike Martin travel America with a forge and the backing of their RAWtools ministry to use the blacksmith trade to visually pound guns over an anvil into peaceful implements. Their work is chronicled in the book *Beating Guns* by Shane Claiborne who also took part in the service. The Rev. Trace Browning and gun violence victim Carolyn Tuft also lead the congregation in a somber remembrance of victims.

Victims of gun violence, including Bishop Scott Hayashi, were invited to join in the pounding of metal that had been heated in a forge. That metal started the day as a rifle or handgun and within a few hours can be used to plant a tree or another plant. The tool that was made for the observance at All Saints is available for a traveling display.


