#### Vigil to End Gun Violence at All Saints Streamed to Facebook Live



All Saints Salt Lake City's Taizé service on Sunday, December 9th was held in conjunction with The Vigil to End Gun Violence in cooperation with the Gun Violence Prevention Center of Utah. Every year, a nationwide vigil is held to bring awareness to gun violence and support all those affected by it. The vigil is held on or near the anniversary of the tragic Sandy Hook shooting of 2012. The service was beautiful and well-attended.

Gun violence prevention is a hallmark of Bishop Scott B. Hayashi's ministry and

the diocese was honored to help stream this event to Facebook live so that those who couldn't be there could participate from home.

It was the first successful stream to Facebook Live using only a camera, laptop and streaming software. Success with this portable setup means the diocesan communications office will be able to stream more services and events throughout the diocese going forward.

The livestream of the service, which is available to view on All Saint's Facebook page, has garnered 315 views.


## **Announcing "GO" Mondays Monthly Youth Gatherings**
