**REFLECTING ON 150 YEARS IN
THE DIOCESE OF UTAH**

As we observe our heritage in this, our 151st year of the Episcopal Church in Utah, we continue to reflect on our history through photos. This photo is of St. John's, Logan, when it was a mission church. The photo was taken in 1885. The efforts to establish St. John's began about 10 years earlier when Bishop Tuttle rode to Logan on the first railroad train that reached the town. His goal was to establish a parish in Logan as the "northern outpost" of the Episcopal Church in Utah. He succeeded, and establish the parish along with a school.

DIOCESAN CONVENTION 2019



The convention for the Episcopal Diocese of Utah will be held April 26-27, 2019, at St. Mark's Cathedral in Salt Lake City. Registration, a convention fact sheet, tentative schedule, nominations and resolutions will be posted to the diocesan website's [convention page](#).

Bishop Hayashi has determined there is not a need for a pre-convention meeting.

This convention, we will be electing deputies to General Convention 2021, which will be held in late June or early July in Baltimore, Maryland. There will be four deputies from each order, cleric and lay, and four alternates for each. Under the resolution passed at the 2017 Diocesan Convention, the diocese will reimburse reasonable expenses for all deputies and the first alternate from each order who attends the full General Convention. Pursuant to resolution, no other alternates from either order will receive reimbursement for any expenses or compensation to attend

the convention.

FROM AROUND THE DIOCESE

Diocese continues major website project for the wider Episcopal Church

The international Episcopal Church has once again contracted with the Diocese of Utah to update the widely used Title IV training website and to create another



training website and to create another website for Title IV in the Spanish language.

The Diocesan Communications Office created the first website in English to train clerics, disciplinary boards, diocesan officers, and congregations in the church's comprehensive misconduct policy. The website, www.titleiv.org features nearly 200 videos filmed by Communications Director Craig Wirth, as well as text created by Chancellor Stephen Hutchinson, Canon Wirth and Social Media Director and Communications Assistant Director Halee Oliver. The Diocese is updating that site that has been used by over 3,000 people per month.

Additionally, the Diocese is starting a three-year project to create a similar website in Spanish. It is designed to be sensitive to the numerous cultures and heritages of those who speak Spanish in the church. Wirth and Salt Lake producer Lucia Chavarria have started extensive "best practices" interviews throughout the church, including two dozen interviews in Puerto Rico, Texas, and California. The contract offers the Diocese new funding sources to be used in furthering work with churches in Utah and northern Arizona, as well as our long-standing efforts to bring state-of-the-art communications services to our churches and people.



Communications Director Craig Wirth is leading our diocesan production team in creating a major Spanish language Title IV website for the wider church.
