**REFLECTING ON 150 YEARS IN
THE DIOCESE OF UTAH**

As we observe our heritage in this, our 151st year of the Episcopal Church in Utah, we continue to reflect on our history through photos. Dr. John Hamilton and Phildilia Hamilton were some of our first lay members of the Episcopal Church in Utah. Dr. Hamilton was the first doctor at St. Mark's Hospital and Phildilia Hamilton played the organ for years at the Cathedral. She was one of the first three Episcopal communicants who greeted Bishop Tuttle upon his arrival in 1867. This picture was donated to the state historical society by Bishop Watson many years later. The Hamilton family is pictured riding in a 1890 model carriage.


He suggests that being a compassionate listener can make a difference. If you are aware of someone in your community who needs help, you can also direct them to resources, such as food banks within our diocese.

DIOCESAN CONVENTION 2019

Call to Convention



The Rt. Rev. Scott B. Hayashi has issued a call for a Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of Utah to be held April 26-27, 2019, at St. Mark's Cathedral in Salt Lake City. This call is made in accordance with the Canons of the Episcopal Diocese of Utah. Official details, the solicitation and posting of resolutions, the solicitation and posting of nominations, registration, reports, a calendar of events and other official information will be posted in February on [the diocesan website](#).

Bishop Scott B. Hayashi is reserving the right to conduct a pre-convention meeting if necessary. He asks that clerics, delegates and wardens save March 23rd as the tentative date. By March 1st, a decision will be made as to whether or not the meeting will be held.

This convention, we will be electing deputies to General Convention 2021, which will be held in late June or early July in Baltimore, Maryland. There will be four deputies from each order, cleric and lay, and four alternates for each. Under the resolution passed at the 2017 Diocesan Convention, the diocese will reimburse reasonable expenses for all deputies and the first alternate from each order who attends the full General Convention. Pursuant to resolution, no other alternates from either order will receive reimbursement for any expenses or compensation to attend the convention.

The days are cold and there's a foot of snow on the play yard, but inside St. Elizabeth's parish hall the Arts-Kids are having a great time with their projects.


