
# COVID-19 Cases in Florida

Deaths: 22,188



The purpose of this guide is to walk through the COVID-19 vaccination clinic journey and what to expect throughout this process.

**We come to you!** Our pharmacy teams will administer COVID-19 vaccinations through our on-site clinic model, making it easy and convenient for your facility's patients and employees to get vaccinated against the coronavirus.

**Timeline Diagram:**

- OCTOBER: CDC survey open for selection of preferred pharmacy providers; CDC survey window closes and list of partners provided to CVS for scheduling.
- NOVEMBER: Educational webinar available to LTC facilities.
- DECEMBER: Confirmation phone call to LTC facility to review clinic details and confirms first 2 clinic dates; Patient/Facility completes patient consent forms and makes copies of insurance card information.
- JANUARY: Clinic 1 execution for first dose of COVID-19 vaccine; Identify new admissions and first dose patients.
- FEBRUARY: Clinic 2 execution for second dose of COVID-19 vaccine; Clinic 3 execution, if needed.

\*Sample timeline. You should expect a similar clinic cadence, but your actual dates may vary depending on the date on which your clinic is scheduled to occur.





Long Term Care Facilities Add'l Info - 1	Descriptions
Current number of residents in your facility who are currently positive for COVID-19:	Total number of current residents onsite in your facility who are currently COVID-19 positive based on test results. Exclude previous positives who are now cleared (based on test-based or symptom-based strategy). Do not include persons who were previously positive and have recovered.
Number of former residents (discharged or transferred) who tested positive for COVID-19:	Total number of residents who were COVID-19 positive while in your facility but were temporarily transferred or discharged from your facility because of COVID-19. Include transfers to hospitals or other health care facilities. Do not include transferred residents once they are cleared or would no longer be considered positive (based on a test-based or symptom-based strategy).
For the previous day (12:00am to 11:59pm), total residents with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 that were transferred out of your facility to a hospital or health care facility:	Number of COVID + or suspected residents transferred out of the facility yesterday.
Designated area: Does your facility have a designated wing or building to isolate COVID-19 positive residents if needed?	Answer Yes if you have a designated, distinct area in your facility with dedicated staff to properly isolate residents if they are positive for COVID-19.
Accepting COVID admissions: Does your facility have a dedicated COVID-19 wing or unit AND are you accepting admissions/transfers of COVID-19 positive residents?	Answer Yes if you are able to admit residents into a dedicated, distinct COVID-19 positive wing, unit, or building.
Number of staff who have tested positive for COVID-19:	Number of current employees who are currently positive for COVID-19. Exclude any staff who have recovered based on a test-based or symptom-based strategy.
Total number of all staff (i.e. clinical, housekeeping, nutrition, maintenance, administration, and contract):	Number of all current staff. Include all positions, all shifts, including contract.
Are you currently conducting routine COVID-19 testing of your staff?	Are you conducting routine surveillance staff testing on a schedule at this time. For example every week, biweekly or monthly staff testing.
For the previous day (12:00am to 11:59pm), total number of staff that were tested for COVID-19	Number of individual staff who were administered a COVID-19 test for the previous day
For the previous day (12:00am to 11:59pm), total number of residents that were tested for COVID-19	Number of individual residents who were administered a COVID-19 test for the previous day
Enter your CLIA / CLIA waiver (lab) number	If your facility holds a certificate or certificate of waiver from AHCA to perform laboratory tests from the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Act (CLIA) enter the CLIA ID number. If your
