Healthy Acadia and the Hancock County Drug Free Communities Initiative will sponsor, “The Role of Life Experiences in Raising Healthy & Thriving Children & Communities,” a free presentation and community discussion featuring Kristen Plummer of the Maine Resilience Building Network.
