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Gleaners Collected, Distributed 28,000 Pounds of Food in 2019

Thanks to the incredible generosity of community members across the Downeast region, Healthy Acadia's Downeast Gleaning Initiative collected and distributed 28,042 pounds of produce from farms and gardens across Hancock and Washington counties in 2019. This achievement wouldn't have been possible without the 155 volunteers, including the University of Maine Cooperative Extension, Master Gardeners, public school and college students, and community members who supported the project.

The Gleaning Initiative partners with farms and food pantries to make fresh, local produce available to more people across the two counties. Developed in 2013 in partnership with the University of Maine Cooperative Extension, the project has collected 256,000 pounds of produce from farms, farmers markets, orchards, and gardens across the Downeast region.

Highlights from the 2019 season include:

- The renovation of a 3,000 square foot garden at Washington Academy in East Machias, where 4-H Tech Changemakers, Master Gardeners and community members grew over 2,000 pounds of produce
- Collaboration with eight schools to engage 106 students in gleaning activities
- A new partnership with Bucksport Regional Health Center to provide free gleaned produce to patients
- Partnership with the Ellsworth Drug Treatment Court to provide 285 pounds of free produce, recipes, and nutrition information to people in recovery
- Engagement with seven youth through Healthy Acadia's Teen Ag Program to construct a 1,500 square foot memorial garden at Narraguagus Junior-Senior High School in Harrington
- The annual Apple Glean at Johnston's Orchard in Ellsworth. On a sunny fall morning, 48 volunteers came together to harvest over 7,600 pounds of apples for 28 food security agencies across the region. Special thanks to Marjorie Peronto, Univ. of Maine Extension Educator for the two counties, who organizes the annual event, and to Brett and Doris Johnston, who generously host the event each year.
- 100% of Gleaning Initiative volunteers report a deeper connection to their local food system as a result of their involvement, and 60% have increased their own consumption of local food.
