This is a BIG construction project for Hamilton and a real job creation opportunity! As our community prepares for this new infrastructure, Workforce Planning Hamilton created the following guide to share skills information on the occupations required to build and maintain the LRT. This guide will reveal the impact on jobs of this major infrastructure development and will inspire students and job seekers to explore the great opportunities available.

Our guide highlights the types of jobs that will be available throughout the construction of the LRT and skills, competencies and training necessary to be successful in a career in these fields. It also offers some insights into the jobs required to maintain it after it is built.

During construction, there will be approximately 3,500 construction jobs in Hamilton and another 300 jobs to deliver regular operations and maintenance.²

To determine which occupations appeared in the guide, Workforce Planning Hamilton consulted with industry partners and other LRT projects regarding information on education, salary, work environment/hours of work and future prospects. In addition, national resources and other Canadian studies were used to develop a full range of information for each occupation featured in the guide.

Workforce Planning Hamilton has selected only a few of the many careers required for the LRT project in Hamilton. Readers are urged to explore the many other career opportunities available in this area through excellent on-line resources appearing throughout the guide.

The occupations are organized in this document by which phase of the LRT the job is required.

PHASE 1: Planning and preparing for the LRT (jobs required from current day- 2019)

PHASE 2: Construction of the LRT (jobs required from 2019- 2024)

PHASE 3: Maintaining and operating the LRT (jobs required from 2024- unknown)

CONSTRUCTION



Construction

During LRT construction there will be major disruptions, streetlights and utilities will be relocated, temporary traffic signals might be installed, traffic will be diverted and all of this will be accomplished by a large workforce. During the implementation of the LRT, tracks, landscaping around the tracks, traffic islands, LRT stops, LRT shelters and other infrastructure will be created.

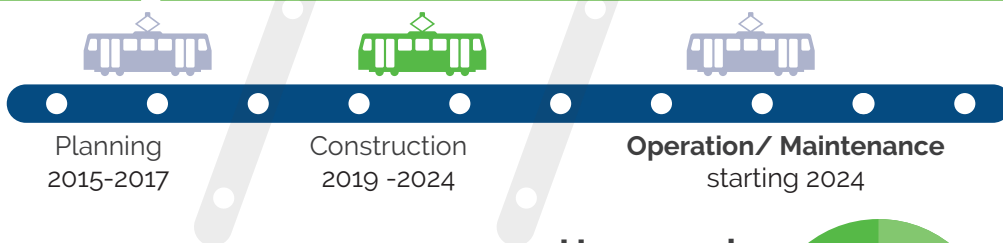

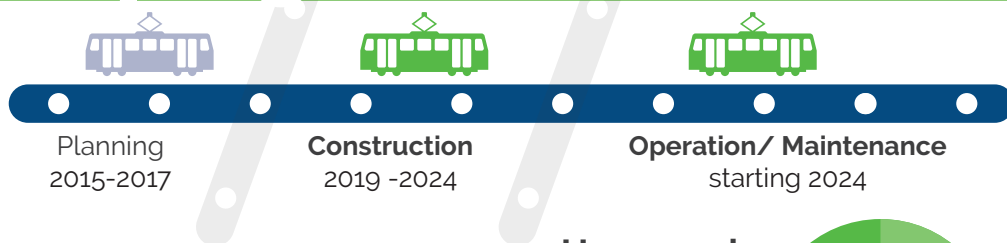

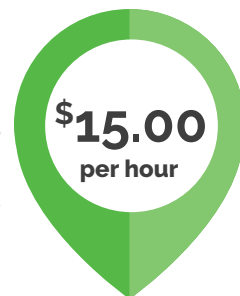
What will I be doing?
