Program History	MLSTD Pre-Apprenticeship Program Overview – Introduced in 2000 with Mohawk 1 st offering taking place in 2001 – 21 years – Over 50 Programs in various trades as a Proponent (Primary Deliverer & with Community Partners. All based on industry demand & labour market support.
Program Overview	Funded by the Province of Ontario (Tuition Free) – Mandatory Attendance 25 Week Full Time Program - 17 Weeks in School – Basic Level 1 – Trades Training (8 Week Apprenticeship Standard in an Extended Blended/Virtual & In-Person Format.

In addition, the program also includes: Gas Technician Certifications (GT-3) All gas certification programs and courses offered at Mohawk College are accredited by the TSSA. (TECHNICAL STANDARDS & SAFETY AUTHORITY) In order to qualify to apply to the TSSA for the certification exams, students are required to achieve a minimum of 75% in both the theory and practical portions for each course as well as maintain a minimum attendance of 80% in both the theory and practical portions. Upon successful completion of the training courses students can apply directly to the TSSA to schedule their exams, which are administered by the TSSA.

Outcome If you are successful in the in-school training by achieving a **60% minimum academic** standing in all of the courses (Reportable Subjects) you are deemed eligible to receive an Acknowledgement of Completion Certificate for the Basic Level 1 & if you are hired on as an apprentice within 2 years of the program completion you are eligible for a Basic Level 1 exemption.

- 2) Include a copy of your current resume in your e-mail.
- 3) We may request a copy of your OSSD, GED, equivalent or a copy of your high school / post-secondary transcript – college academic upgrading transcript if you have not completed your OSSD or GED.
- 4) Once your completed application has been accepted and you are deemed eligible you will then be sent a link to sign-up for the online Assessment Session.

Assessment Process

- 1) Eligible testers will receive an invitation link to an online testing site (through Mohawk College) and a password. Additional information on the testing process will be included in the email.
Not everyone who applies will be eligible to test.
- 2) We will be opening sessions on a demand basis.
- 3) Duration of tests will be 2-2.5 hours (TBD).
- 4) Once Assessment Result have been tallied you will be advised if your application will be moving forward & be consulted on any next steps.

Acceptance Letters

- 1) Will be sending out to the 18 program applicants per program via e-version Letter of Acceptance as well as next steps.
- 2) Upon receipt of the letter of acceptance, you will be required to: Acknowledge your acceptance into the program by emailing me at kate.gibson@mohawkcollege.ca. Please include: Your full name and Pre-apprenticeship program in the Subject Line and confirmation of acceptance into the Pre-Apprenticeship Training Program no later than: (max.5 days after the date sent on the letter). Failure to contact the college to state your intention to participate in the program by the designated date will result in a program seat forfeit.

Important Information

Need to Know

Must be able to commit to the training for the entire 17 weeks in-school program
Attendance is mandatory – Extended Apprenticeship Attendance Ruling will apply - 5 consecutive days
Of absences and you are ceased trained (exited) from the program.
Successful completion of the curriculum will also apply - any failures will also result in a program exit
You must be responsible for you own learning.
