



In August, Hamilton's youth labour force saw a 3% decline compared to last month.

More youth entered full-time employment in August.



INDUSTRIES

In August 2023, the top growing industry in terms of employment for Ontario was Professional, Scientific and Technical with 24,200 new workers. Following was Construction with 10,800 new workers and Wholesale Trade with 9,800 new workers.

The top declining industry were Educational Services with a decline in workers by 35,600 followed by Manufacturing (-13,600) and Business, Building and Other Support Services (-11,200).
