Responsibilities

- Provide friendly, timely and professional customer service
- Provide fist point of contact for families/individuals interested in becoming a host home.
- Conduct screening procedures to ensure host home is a safe and welcoming place for a new family. This includes but is not limited to assessing applications, collecting CRC's, conducting interviews and home visits.
- Provide orientation and training to host homes who have been approved to provide temporary accommodations to new families.
- Matching Ukrainians with appropriate host homes taking into account the needs of the newcomer family to ensure safety and security
- Monitor match to ensure it is a good fit and to negotiate any conflicts or issues with host and new family
- Assist Ukrainian family with finding permanent housing
- Make referrals to settlement and employment programs
