As yet another tumultuous year comes to a close, **we are proud to present you with a summary of our 2021 accomplishments.** In March 2020, just hours before our speakers were scheduled to fly to the USA, we were forced to cancel the Roots North

American spring speaking tour. With the COVID-19 pandemic, many of our local people-to-people programs were also forced into hibernation. We seized this extra staff time to focus on team-building, developing our virtual community infrastructure, and reaching thousands of people across the world through digital programming. **We enter 2022 with a powerful resurgence and growth in programming and activism.**

Considering all that transpired over the past year, from President Trump's 'Deal of the Century' to Israel-Gulf normalization deals, to the outbreak of civil violence last May in Israeli-Palestinian cities, we are reminded how quickly reality can change and why working towards lasting Israeli-Palestinian reconciliation remains as critical as ever. Our work takes place deep inside the level of identity, where there are no shortcuts, and it is fueled by a core belief that the more our work challenges us, the more transformative and lasting its impact will be.

As 2021 comes to an end, we feel full of gratitude for the revitalization of our activities. We have created new branches and community centers in the West Bank-Judea/Samaria, vastly increased our programming, and hired new talented staff. Our team is stronger and more dedicated than ever before. Please read on to learn about how our message is gaining recognition, and how our movement is growing.

We thank you for all you have done to help Roots expand and deepen our work – the impact that we describe in this report would simply not be possible without you. Exciting Developments for 2022

Development of the Jordan Valley and Ariel-Nablus Branches

Our two satellite branches, each developed by a joint Israeli-Palestinian leadership team, are poised to increase Roots' impact and reach in 2022 and empower our leaders to design programs tailored to their local needs. We are raising funds to restore the Ouja natural spring in the Jordan Valley; this large project will impact the thousands of locals who visit the area every week, and bring Palestinians and Israelis together to take shared responsibility for the land.

Alumni Network

Roots' Young Adults Program has produced a network of over 130 Israelis and Palestinians in their young 20's. This year, we surveyed past participants to gauge what they need from Roots, and our new Alumni Program staff are working hard to craft programs to utilize these "Ambassadors of Roots" next year. They have asked for:

- Peer leadership committees
- Ongoing reunion events to sustain the relationships they've built
- Monthly conversations for Israeli alumni to process how their national/army service fits with the work of Roots
- An entrepreneurial incubator to create meaningful employment opportunities for our Palestinian alumni

Staff Growth

Roots has welcomed incredible talent to our team, as demonstrated at our recent staff workshop with fifteen attendees! Our Alumni Program is now headed by Ethel Melka, who interned with us all of last year, and Noor Awad (whom many of you have probably heard speak at Roots events). Amna Jabarin joined our team as the Palestinian Coordinator of our Women's Program. Amana Aharonreich joined Yoel Ilani as joint facilitators of our Young Adults Program. Amir Halawi has become a trusted translator and assistant to Khaled. Eran Avidor is working to advance programming in our Jordan Valley branch. Rachel Cohen, who was interning with us, became our Communications Manager, and lastly, Reuven Stone has joined the Roots team as our first-ever full-time Director of Development.

8 Key Accomplishments in 2021

Engaging Local Communities

1. RUNS FOR RECONCILIATION

In 2021, we held our 2nd and 3rd Roots Runs for Reconciliation! On March 14 in the Jordan Valley and on October 17 in the Bethlehem/Gush Etzion area, over **80 Palestinian and Israeli activists** ran together, finishing with closing ceremonies that celebrated their work as partners for peace. Approximately 30 supporters around the world joined the runs as ambassadors for Roots, spreading our message in their home communities and fundraising for our work in London, Toronto, Shanghai, Los Angeles, Andhra Pradesh, Suldalsosen, and beyond.

The fundraising campaigns for these two events together brought in a stunning \$130,000.



2. ROOTS RAN A SUCCESSFUL SIX-MONTH PILOT PROGRAM FOR 35 STUDENTS AND YOUNG PROFESSIONALS

in the southern Jordan Valley. This group met consistently on a bi-weekly basis, and held a powerful joint vigil for the victims of the fighting last May.



3. THIS PAST RAMADAN, ROOTS RAISED OVER \$12,000 TO SUPPORT MORE THAN 100 PALESTINIAN FAMILIES IN OUR NETWORK UNDER FINANCIAL STRAIN.

Along with the over 600 participants in our series of Iftar (break-fast) meals, these actions helped strengthen the Roots community in accordance with the traditional values of the month of Ramadan - sharing with those in need.

4. AS INSTANCES OF EXTREMIST SETTLER VIOLENCE BECOME MORE FREQUENT, ROOTS' ISRAELI ACTIVISTS HAVE BEEN WORKING WITHIN ISRAELI COMMUNITIES TO ADDRESS THIS HORRIFIC PHENOMENON.

Actions have included work with local leaders, engaging with social services, supporting a network of citizens willing to intervene, and advising the military on the prevention of violence. During the outbreak of violence in May, Roots activists successfully prevented several instances of violence on the part of both Palestinians and Israelis.

5. THIS YEAR SAW THE BIRTH OF OUR PALESTINIAN LOCAL LEADERSHIP BOARD, WHICH MEETS MONTHLY AND HAS APPOINTED BOARD OFFICERS.

The board serves as a platform to bring issues and initiatives to the attention of the joint Roots leadership, as well as to empower Roots members within their home communities.



Strategic Partnerships and Development

6. ROOTS' LEADERSHIP HAS BEEN INVITED TO VARIOUS THINK-TANKS AND INITIATIVES THAT AIM TO REFRAME AND STRATEGIZE AROUND THE CHANGING REALITY ON THE GROUND.

Roots leaders are active members today of Bridging Insights, Van Leer Institute's "Expanding the Imagination of Peace," Friedrich Herbet Fund, Forum for Regional Thinking, and A Land For All. We also participated in the Alliance for Middle East Peace (ALLMEP) Alumni Forum with other youth programs to develop common strategies. Additionally, our leadership team worked with Amal-Tikva to develop our Strategic Plan, which refined our vision and theory of change.

7. ROOTS PARTNERED WITH TOGETHER BEYOND WORDS

to create an intensive long-term identity and trauma workshop for many of our Israeli and Palestinian staff and core activists.
