NICOLE KRAUSS is one of the most important novelists writing today. Her 2005 book, *History of Love*, is an enthralling tale of loneliness and the power of literature to create bonds across time and space. Her 2011 book, *Great House*, which won a National Book Award, explores memory, loss and storytelling. Her 2017 novel, *Forest Dark*, takes place in Tel Aviv, with two protagonists on spiritual quests to free themselves from their respective obsessions. Krauss' work resonates widely with a universal audience and has been translated into more than 30 languages.
